MONTREAL, May 12-(CP) - Steers were barely steady today on Montreal livestock markets, while cows were strong, hogs 25 cents higher and veal calves 25 to 50 cents lower than the close of last week's market. Receipts: cattle, 1,000; calves, 2,120; sheep, 322; hogs, 1,328. Good steers opened at \$8.50 to \$9 with medium steers from \$7.50 to \$8.50 and common from \$6 to \$7.25. Fed calves or baby heifers were from \$8 to \$9. Heifers ranged from \$5 to \$8.50. Good cows were strong at \$6.50 to \$7, medium \$5.75 to \$6.25, and common from \$4.75 to \$5.50. Canners and cutters \$5 to \$4.50. Bulls were \$4.50 to \$7. Good bulls selling from \$6.50 up. Today's receipts of calves were the heaviest for any Monday this year to date. Prices were 25 to 30 cents lower than the close of the week. Medium good to good veal brought \$8 to \$8.50 with good kinds around \$9 and two tops selling at \$9.50 to \$10. Medium kinds brought \$7.50 to \$8 and common light veals and drinkers from \$5.50 to \$6. The bulk of calves were of common to just fair quality. Veals and drinkers were sold between \$5.75 and \$7. Grassers \$3.50 to \$5. The few spring lambs offered were sold at \$5 to \$7 each with one lamb weighing 70 pounds or better at \$10. Sheep were from \$3.50 to \$6, mostly \$5.50 to \$6. Hogs were 25 cents higher selling at \$12.50 for B-1 dressed with a small lot at \$12.25, \$9.50 for B-1 alive fed and watered. Grade A drew \$1 per hog premium with discounts on off grades. Feeder hogs were \$9.50 to \$10 according to weight and quality and cows were \$5.50 to \$6.50 with a top of \$7 live weight and \$8 to \$8.50 dressed.

NEW YORK, May 12-(CP) - The Canadian dollar gained 1-8 cent to a discount of 12 3-4 per cent in relation to the United States dollar on the foreign exchange market today. Ottawa was quoted at 123-1/2, the rate 9.09-.991 per cent discount. The pound sterling, on the other hand, lost 1-4 cent to 44.03 1-4. The Hong Kong and Shanghai dollars moved slightly higher, while the Argentine free peso and the German benevolent mark declined.
