The Ontario Legislature is now made up of 51 Liberals and 41 Conservatives, with two seats still vacant. The Liberal majority at present is ten.

The city council of Montreal has decided to take a census of the city early in the New Year, and at intervals of three years thereafter. The next decennial census of the United Kingdom, Canada, and several other British possessions will be taken in the year 1901.
