Minister Pays Tribute To P. E. Island War Effort

Corrects Misunderstanding With Regard To Army Recruiting Program And Warns Against Spirit Of Complacency.

Prince Edward Island's war record is not excelled by any Province and I think there are only one or two that might equal it," declared Col. the Hon. J. L. Ralston, Minister of National Defense, in addressing the Charlottetown Rotary Club luncheon yesterday. "I want to congratulate you on that splendid record. More power to you. It only means that your hearts are in the job we have before us." That job, Col. Ralston said, was "putting out the fires" which threaten to devastate world civilization.
