MOTOR AMBULANCE FOR THE FRONT

ST. JOHN, April 30 - We cannot all fight in the trenches, but we can all assist in some way in the great struggle.

One of the greatest needs at the front just at present is motor ambulances of the stretcher type which will stand the great strains and test to which they are subject.
