All through her years of illness and suffering she was never heard to murmur or complain. About four years ago she was stricken with a severe attack of rheumatism, and from that time although under medical treatment, and the best home care a loving family could do she never regained strength, but slowly faded away and on the above date passed to her eternal reward at the age of sixty-nine years.

BLIND BAGGAGE TRAVELER
CROSSES THREE FRONTIERS

PARIS, Dec 4.—Judding blind baggage behind the tender of a locomotive 38 hours, Arton Hjesky recently crossed three frontiers without being molested. The 17-year-old Hungarian youth may not have established a distance record for this style of travel, but he is believed to have set a new mark in dodging customs officers, having evaded six checks of them.

Hjesky told the French police he got aboard the train as it was starting from the Budapest station. Dressed in overalls and jumper, he alighted at the Austrian, Swiss and French frontiers and mingled with railroad employes in the yards until the train was ready to get under way again. Then he would resume his place behind the tender. In this fashion he rode nearly 1,000 miles into Paris.

He returned to the Swiss frontier in style, having an entire second-class compartment to himself, while two French policemen took the greatest care looking after him.

DRAINAGE WORK DONE—A considerable portion of the low land on the Blake property at the Experimental Farm Station was drained last month, the exceptionally dry season permitting the work to be done thoroughly. The balance of the turnip crop was harvested early in the month.

A FINE WEATHER RECORD—The highest temperature recorded for the month of November was 50 degrees, the lowest 19 degrees, and the monthly mean or average, 39.616 degrees. The mean temperature, according to the meteorological report of the Experimental Farm Station, was higher than any recorded by the Station for November and 5 degrees higher than the average for fourteen years. The rainfall of 3.41 inches was below the average and the number of hours of sunshine, 732 hours, was 5.3 hours above the average.

WEDDING BELLS—A very interesting event took place at St. Bonaventure's church, Tracadie, on Monday morning, Nov. 12th, when Mr. E. J. Reardon of Cove Head Rd was united in marriage with Miss Rilla MacDonald of the same place the ceremony being performed by the pastor, Rev. J. B. McIntyre. The bride who looked very charming in a suit of blue was attended by her cousin, Miss Margaret MacDonald of Tracadie, who also wore blue. The groom was supported by Mr. Frank Reardon of Charlottetown. After the ceremony the wedding party motored to various points of interest, returning in the evening to the home of the groom where a wedding reception awaited them including only the immediate relatives of the bride and groom, and after all partaking of the sumptuous supper, the guests departed to their homes.
