The following amounts are allocated for augmentation:—Tignish, West and Clyde Rivers, West Cape, Cavendish, Caledonia, Woodville, Murray Harbor South, Murray Harbor North, Mount Stewart, St. Peter's Bay, Dundas, Cardigan and Georgetown, \$30 each; Alberton, Bloomfield and Brookfield, \$42 each; New London North, and Valleyfield, \$55 each; Tryon, Boushaw and Orwell, \$82 each; Summerside, St. James', Charlottetown \$88 each; Souris, Strathelyna, and Montague, \$44 each; Clifton, St. Peter's Road and Covehead, \$50 each; Zion, \$83; Princetown, \$90; Richmond Bay, \$45; Bonhas, \$66; Bedeque, \$55; half these amounts respectively will be required for the College Fund for the current year.

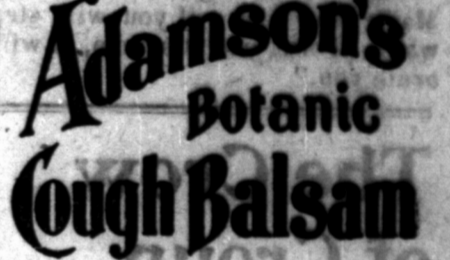
