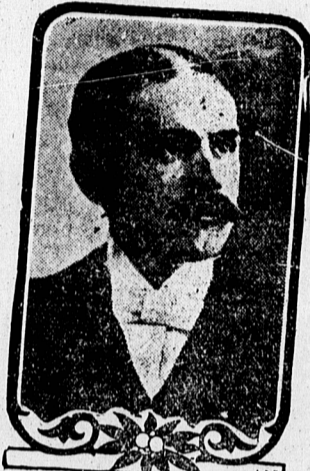

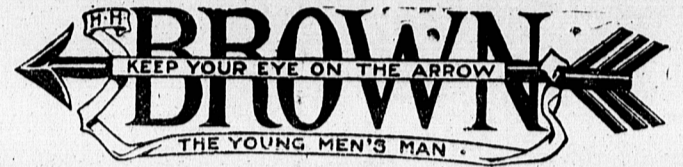

AGAINST RIFLE DRILL IN SCHOOLS.

Dear Sir:—In your editorial of Monday on Military Training in the Schools you invited discussion on that subject. I have eagerly scanned the paper on each morning to see if any opinion would be expressed by your many readers. So far no one has taken the matter up. At the present time nothing is, I think, of such vital interest as this question. Shall we teach our children the art of war as part of the school curriculum? As for the part of the conditions of the Straticona Trust which enjoins the matter of physical training and obedience, I think both these can be taught without the aid of either military manoeuvres or Ross rifles. In one of the most prominent dailies of the Dominion I read an article advocating the military training in the schools. The writer put the thing honestly and squarely. He said "We need not try to mislead boys or disguise plain facts. We want boys to learn to shoot and to shoot straight so as to kill their man every time." This spirit is not the one which I would like to see animate the teacher of my children and I cannot help thinking there are many more like me. I do not want them to be taught the art of killing. It has become a conviction with me and with an increasing number that war is a crime and a disgrace to us in this twentieth century. There seems to be but little advance made all the time since the Advent of the Prince of Peace. Then the Roman citizen made it his great holiday pastime to see the gladiators fight to the death in the arena and the Hun warriors after they had sacked a town amused themselves by tossing babes in the air and catching them as they fell on the points of their spears. Now our talk and our boast is all of Dreadnoughts and super-Dreadnoughts but the spirit is the same. Nor do I believe that all these arms and armaments promote peace any more than I believe that the man who is always displaying the chip on his shoulder and boasting that no one dares knock it off is a promoter of peace in his neighborhood. Holding these convictions I feel that I am bound to act up to them. I am sure it is my duty to discourage in every possible way in my power the training of the children in a thing which is in itself absolutely wrong and directly opposed to the spirit and teaching of the Founder of the Christian religion.
