## BISHOP SWEENEY

### Body of the Dead Prelate Laid to Rest

### IN SOLEMN CEREMONY

#### Many Dignitaries Attend— Bishop Casey, His Successor Enthroned.

**BISHOP SWEENEY'S OBSEQUIES.**  
St. JOHN, March 29.—(Special.)—With all the solemnity of the Catholic Church ritual the body of Bishop Sweeney was laid to rest this afternoon.

Archbishop O'Brien conducted the Requiem Mass and Bishop Casey preached the funeral oration.

**MANY NOTABLE PERSONS PRESENT.**  
Archbishop Bruchese of Montreal, Bishops Blais, McDonald and Barry were present, also many priests from Montreal, New Brunswick and Nova Scotia.

All the Catholic societies in the city walked in the procession and the Lieutenant Governor and staff, Premier Tweedie and other members of the Legislature, the Mayor and members of the City Council and many leading citizens attended a short service also at the grave.

**BISHOP CASEY ENTHRONED.**  
This afternoon Bishop Casey was formally enthroned as successor of the deceased Prelate and Bishop of the Diocese of St. John.

#### The Millinery Room Being Transformed into a Bower of Beauty.

## A SHORT SESSION

### Legislature Held Yesterday Morning

### AND THEN ADJOURNED

#### Until Monday Afternoon—Bill For Registration of Deeds Discussed.

**FRIDAY, March 23.**  
House met at 11.15.  
Honorable Mr. Rogers presented a petition of Thomas C. James on behalf of the Presbytery of Prince Edward Island, praying that an act be passed to correct certain errors in certain acts of the Assembly incorporating congregations of the Presbyterian church in connection with the Presbyterian Church of Canada.  
A bill was introduced in accordance therewith and referred to private bills committee.  
Mr. J. F. Arsenault asked the Commissioner of Public Works if it is the intention of the Government to finish a road extending from the St. Gilbert Road in Lot 14 through to the Western Road near Wellington Church.  
Hon. Commissioner of Public Works said that the works was now being considered by the Government and the road would be opened during the coming summer.  
Mr. J. F. Arsenault asked the Commissioner of Public Works if the Government have taken any steps towards the opening of a road in Lots 14 and 13, called the Thaddy Road. If so is it the intention of the Government to open and finish it during the coming summer; also the cost of right-of-way and names of parties to whom rights-of-way are to be paid to.

## MANILA TIDINGS

### Aguinaldo Hears Some Good Advice

### BEST FOUND GUILTY

#### Moncton man to Suffer Death For an Atrocious Murder.

#### AGUINALDO HEARS GOOD ADVICE

**MANILA, March 29.**—(Special.)—Aguinaldo to-day conferred with his old friend here who explained the hopelessness of further resistance and advised him to urge the people to submit to American rule.

#### NATIVES GIVING UP THEIR ARMS.

Five natives, who murdered Archibald Wilson an Englishman were hanged to-day.

Twelve thousand natives have taken the oath and to-day a large number of insurgents gave up their arms.

#### BEST FOUND GUILTY OF MURDER.

**SALEM, Mass., March 29.**—With a smile on his face and a pronounced nonchalant air, John C. Best formerly of Moncton, N. B. heard a jury of twelve Essex county citizens condemn him as guilty of wilfully murdering last October George E. Bailey, his fellow-workman at the Breakheart Hill farm in Saugus.

#### PENALTY DEATH—AN AWFUL CRIME.

A verdict of murder in the first degree in Massachusetts leads to but one thing—death—and to-night Best stands in the shadow of the electric chair.

The Jury debated a little over six hours with a short respite for supper, about an average length for a capital case based on circumstantial evidence, finally agreeing that Best and Loos other committed the fearful deed of shooting Bailey dead in his tracks, of cutting up his still warm body, of placing the dismembered parts in harley bags and then trying to hide his crime by sinking the ghastly remains in a pond some distance away.

#### HOOLEY STILL TRIUMPHANT.

**LONDON, March 27.**—An interview published last week with the chairman of Promoter Hooley's committee of creditors reveals an astonishing condition of affairs. The creditors hitherto have received two shillings in the pound with the prospect of two shillings more. Meanwhile the chairman of the committee has been irritated to see Hooley living like a millionaire. He still runs three country seats, paying £150 a week to his servants in wages and keeping horses, carriages, gardeners, gamekeepers, etc., galore.

## BUDGET DEBATE

### A Senator and Ex-Commoner Dead

### AN I. C. R. SMASHUP

#### Engine and Seven Cars Derailed—Commons Gives Gov't 54 Majority.

**QUEBEC, March 29.**—(Special.)—Senator J. A. Paquet died this morning quite suddenly from a complication of pneumonia and inflammation. He was a Liberal and a very wealthy merchant. He was appointed to the Senate in 1898.

#### AN I. C. R. SMASH-UP.

**MONCTON, March 29.**—(Special.)—An I. C. R. special freight struck a trolley loaded with rails this morning and the engine and seven cars were derailed and badly smashed.

#### CANADIAN HORSES FOR SOUTH AFRICA.

**MONTREAL, March 29.**—(Special.)—Col. Dent, British Remount Officer, will ship a thousand Canadian horses as soon as they can be secured for South Africa. Col. Dent wants remount stations established in Canada.

#### BUDGET DEBATE CLOSED.

**OTTAWA, March 29.**—The debate on the budget continued last evening. A division occurred on an amendment at 5 o'clock this morning as follows: Against amendment, 118; for amendment, 64; paired, 24; absent, 2.

#### DEATH OF FIRMAN MCLURE.

**TRURO, March 29.**—(Special.)—Eirman McLure died last evening. Deceased was a lawyer and prohibitionist, born in 1861. He was elected to the N. S. Assembly in 1896 and at a by-election in 1897 was elected to the Commons. He was defeated at the last election and subsequently appointed Census Commissioner.
