Canadiens Reach Tie Place In League By Defeating Bruins 2-1

BOSTON, Nov. 21—(CP)—Montreal Canadiens gained a first place tie with Toronto Maple Leafs in the National Hockey League standing tonight as they rallied to defeat Boston Bruins 2-1 for their fifth successive game without a loss.

Canadiens took all of Boston's terrific power in stride and although outshot 30-14, punched home the goals when needed with Earl Robinson tallying the winner in the third period on a play with Marty Barry.

While protesting their unblemished record of four victories and tie in five games, Canadiens had to soar to supreme defensive heights for the Bruins blasted their cage with a 10-shot barrage in each period.

They had to come from behind, too, for Boston opened the scoring about half-way through the first period when Roy Conacher beat brilliant Claude Bourque from 20 feet out after taking Mel Hill's perfect pass.
