ALLEGED ADVANTAGES OF THE BRULE ROUTE.

The pleasant excursion by the S.S. Harland to Tatamagouche Bay has quite naturally revived the discussion of the projected Brule route. It is quite natural, too, that it should find favor with such residents of Charlottetown as can readily accept all the good things which its sanguine promoters think would result from its adoption as a line of winter and summer travel and transportation. The scheme in its entirety contemplates making Charlottetown an all-year-round port, which, if it could be realized, would be a fine thing for our metropolitan city and port. But in many cases the promoters of new and costly schemes claim all possible advantages to the full while not making sufficient allowance for possible obstacles, drawbacks and disadvantages. If Brule were connected by a direct line of rails across country to Truro, a distance of some 25 miles, the route would afford an almost straight line from Charlottetown to Halifax by steamer and rail, and a saving of perhaps 50 miles distance between the two cities as compared with the route via Pictou. But there would be those 25 miles of railway to build, and at \$50,000 a mile that would cost \$1,250,000. What hope have we that the Ottawa Government would undertake so costly a work for such an object? What hope can we reasonably have that the Government, which takes away the steamers from this port almost as soon as the first ice forms in winter, would consent to make Charlottetown a terminal for the winter boats? Hitherto the influences centering around Pictou have been very influential with the Government, and if the adoption of Charlottetown as a winter terminal would be hard to bring about, the abandonment of Pictou would be equally hard to effect. Now The Guardian would like to see Charlottetown made a winter port for the Government steamers so long as we are forced to depend upon steamers for winter transportation. But we do not believe that steamers will ever remove our winter disabilities whether by the Brule route or the Pictou route. And we do not believe that the present Government or its successor will ever adopt the Brule route. The mere promise of a survey or an inquiry counts for nothing more than a scheme to delay the inevitable Tunnel, which the Government and some of its supporters have treated in such contemptuous fashion. The Tunnel scheme has ten friends to every one in favor of the Brule route. And the people of Prince Edward Island are growing weary of being fooled. It remains for the promoters of the new route to show that the Government is honestly disposed to adopt it, and how the opposition to it east and west in this Province and in Nova Scotia is to be overcome. When this is done we shall be glad to further consider the matter.

THE ICEBERGS OFF THE NEWFOUNDLAND COAST.

In this world of contrasts, while land, and it has been on the southern coast of that island, near St. John's or Cape Race that most of the collisions with bergs have happened. The distance between Montreal and Quebec and Liverpool is nearly 300 miles more by the southern route than by way of Belleisle, and it is by latest accounts the Straits of Belleisle are still blocked with ice. All messages into or out of the Gulf must still be made south of Newfoundland as will be the case this year.

A SERGEANT RETIRES TO EXPRESS A VIGOROUS PROTEST.

An Ex-Sergeant of Infantry writes to the Guardian with considerable length and with strong feeling in protest against the proposal to absorb the 2nd Military District, which comprises Prince Edward Island, into the 1st District, New Brunswick. He characterizes the proposed change as "a wrong that is at once an injustice and an insult." Warned by his superior officers that as one of the force it was his duty to submit in silence what might be ordered, he applied for his discharge and it was granted. There is a very strong feeling throughout the force against the proposed change, which, if carried into effect (as we can hardly believe it will be) must prove at once humiliating and disastrous to the service in this Province. There is no finer body of officers and men in the militia of Canada, in spirit, physique or efficiency than those of Prince Edward Island. Surely our representatives in Parliament have influence enough to prevent this insult being put upon the force. We refrain from printing the ex-Sergeant's letter in full as from the text it would appear that he had in large part misunderstood an article which appeared in these columns some days since.
