Medieval Customs
Perpetuated In
British Rents
By Norman Cribbens
LONDON, Oct. 25 — (CP) — In-
no other country in the world are
so many rents paid in such curi-
ous ways as in Britain.
Every year the Duke of Marl-
borough delivers to the King a
small flag of white satin em-
broidered with fleur-de-lis as to-
ken rent for his rich Blenheim
estate in Oxfordshire.
On the anniversary of the Bat-
tle of Waterloo each year the
Duke of Wellington hands the
King another flag—a miniature
French tricolour—as "rent" for his
estate of Stratfield Saye, Berk-
shire. The estate was originally
bought by the British nation for
£283,000 (41,050,000) as a gift to
Napoleon's conqueror.
It costs only a few pounds each
year to have these small flags
made. But the "service" rents on
which some famous properties are
held from the Crown make even
smaller demands on their owners'
pockets.
A snowball is the token rent
paid to the King by the Lairds of
the Scottish estate of Fowla. The
rental snowball must be obtained,
under terms of the family's char-
ter, from the mountain slopes of

that the King is furnished with
the services of a knight in full
armor when visiting in the dis-
trict.
The Duke of Atholl must pay a
white rose to the Sovereign as
rent for his Scottish estate.
Strangest tenure on which any
British property has ever been
held was probably that of
Satchlemuir Castle in Scotland.
It was granted by King James IV
of Scotland to Sir James Murray
on condition that he provide drink
once a year for a ghost.
The ghost was that of the
King's grandmother, said to re-
turn to the banqueting hall every
New Year's Eve to drink "three
glasses of her favourite port."
Not until the castle was burned
down a few years ago did the
custom of putting out wine for a
ghostly guest cease to be observed.
GHALES WRECK BREAKWATER
SWAKOPMUND, Africa.—(CP)—
The worst equinoctial gales of 1948
century have wrecked a substan-
tial mole here built by German
engineers in 1904. Further north
tidal waves racing inland have
flooded salt pans at Cape Cross,
major source of South Africa's salt
supplies.
