A Blake? The Romance of Your Name By RUBY HASKINS ELLIS



Blake

This family is of English origin and derived its name from the Parish of Blakeford, in the County of Wiltshire.

The most remote ancestor on record is Robert de Blakeford, who was assessed on the Wiltshire Roll of Subsidies for the requirements of Edward I.

Assessments then, as now, were the order of the day, and Kings were expensive luxuries, and Robert Blake, of Calne, a descendant of Robert of Blakeford, appears on a later record when he was called on for requirements of Edward III.

A later Robert of Calne came into possession of large estates in the County of Southampton through his marriage to Avice, the daughter of John Wallop. Both Robert and his wife are buried in the church at Calne, and visitors there may see his likeness in stained-glass windows showing the armorial bearings of the family, and his wife is also shown in a long robe on which the arms of the family are embroidered.

In the sixteenth century, the family scattered and one branch of Robert's descendants moved to Somersetshire, where Humphrey Blake bought large estates in Over Stowey.

One of the first of the Blakes to come to America was William, of Somersetshire, a great grandson of

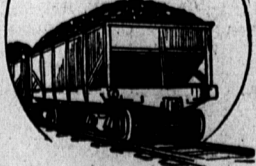

Sherwin-Williams

The common shares of Sherwin-Williams are now selling in the vicinity of 33 to yield about 5 1/2% as the dividend rate is \$1.50 plus a bonus of 20 cents per annum. Earnings for the last fiscal year were equivalent to \$2.65 on the common. No official figures have been published since, but when asked today, a leading official stated that sales in the six months compare favourably with those of the same period in the previous year. This is regarded as satisfactory especially when it is considered that business in the West has felt the effects of conditions there. Increased sales in the East, however, have offset any decline in other localities. The shares of this company are closely held but a certain amount of liquidation has been coming into the market due to special circumstances.

National Brick

The break in National Brick common to 4, a new record low, was due entirely to the liquidation of a small block of stock "at the market" and as there were no buyers the shares were offered down until a purchaser appeared. The National Brick Company in the fiscal year which ended on Feb. 28th, experienced improved business to the extent of about 20% and as earnings for the previous year were equivalent to \$3.08 on the common. It is self-evident that the showing for the current year should at least be as good. This means that the earnings on common are equivalent to 75% of its market value.

CORPORATION DIVIDEND, WAGE AND SALARY RETURNS Due March 31st

The law requires that all Corporations, Joint Stock Companies and Associations shall make information returns covering all dividends, bonuses, wages and salaries paid during the year 1929. Every person who fails to make such returns on or before March 31st is liable to a penalty of \$10.00 for each day of default (maximum penalty not to exceed \$50.00).

Corporation Information Returns are to be made on FORMS T4 and T5, copies of which can be had from your Postmaster, or the Inspector of Income Tax in your district. Act promptly and avoid penalties.

SECRETARIES NOTE: Do not neglect to obtain forms T4 and T5 and file returns immediately.

Now this is a warning to some of our present day "tight wads" who would not give a "kid" a quarter to spend. The child never forgets a kind act.
