CONVICTS MADE ESCAPE

SAN RAFAEL, Calif., February 28. While Rev. C. B. Forbes, a San Francisco clergyman, was delivering a religious lecture at San Quentin penitentiary last night, three convicts took advantage of the assembly to scale the walls and escape.

A fourth inmate, who had walked past several guards, was recognized and stopped at the outer gate, when he betrayed a strange nervousness in the way he said "good evening."

Others were gambling on higher prices for bacon in England and pig hogs up. Last week select hogs closed at \$13.50. On Monday the bulk of the trading was done at \$14.25 and prices continued to advance until at the end of the week select hogs were bringing \$14.75 or \$15.25 over last week's close.

Shippers imagine that there must be some deep seated reason for the continued advance such as a new outlet or abnormally increased demand from the retail trade when the advance is only due to a shift out condition of the dressed meat trade and break the market by over-supplying it.

For this reason shippers should temper their enthusiasm with judgment in regards the cattle market for the next week.
