**Western Oils Up, Golds, Base Metals Down At Toronto**

TORONTO, Jan. 28—(CP)—Two-way trends developed in alighty improved trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange today as western oils made modest advances while golds and base metals eased.

The exchange's closing index showed golds down 74 at 96.53, base metals 25 at 87.20, western oils up 48 at 228.4.

Aunr advanced 6 among senior golds but Hollinger and Kerr Addison dropped 1-4 each. Easter Juniors included Buffadison, Campbell, Central Porcupine, Consolidated Beattie, Giant, God's Lake, Kirkland Lake, MacLeod, Madsen, O'Brien, Pickle Crow and San Antonio.

Base metals losses about doubled gains with losers Falconbridge 10, MacDonald 15, on about 60,000 shares traded, Quemont 3-8, Sherritt 8 and Steep Rock 4. Gainers were Smelters 3-4, East Sullivan 15, Eureka 5, New Calumet 5 and Silanco 12.

**New York Stocks Continue Advance**

NEW YORK, Jan. 28—(CP)—The stock market stretched its bounce off the January low today with leading issues gaining fractions to around 3 points.

Aided by continued demands for railroad shares and occasional flurries in oils, aircrafts and industrial specialties, the list made a second successive advance for the first time in three weeks.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite pushed up .5 of a point to 63.1 for its best climb since Dec. 30, while the utility average which touched a new 1947-48 low Tuesday registered its first improvement since Jan. 17. Transactions totalled 380,000 shares compared with 330,000 in the preceding session.

Canadian issues were higher. Hiram Walker added 1-2. Distillers Seagrams and Dome Mines were both up 3-8. Canadian Pacific added 1-8. McIntyre was unquoted.

On the curb, Lake Shore eased 1-8 and Giant Yellowknife was unquoted.

Union Carbide was ahead 3 at 98 after news of a proposed 3-for-1 stock split. Gulf Oil, ex-rights, closed 2 1-2 higher at 60 1-8 on the exchange after underwriters disposed of a 1,213,443-share offering at 59. Major fractions to a point or more higher were Chrysler at 49 1/2, U. S. Steel (in first response to its higher net income since 1929) at 74 5-8, American Smelting 53 1-2, Douglas Aircraft 55 1-4 and North American Aviation 10 1-4.

International Business Machines on a single transfer was off 4 1-8 at 221 7-8. Despite an increased dividend, Plymouth Oil, dipped 1-4 at the close at 45 3-4.

**Gains Edge Out Losses At Montreal**

MONTREAL, Jan. 28 — (CP)—Gains edged out losses by a narrow margin in selected industrials on the stock exchange and curb market today.

Closing averages indicated banks up 2 at 27.75; utilities off 2 at 17.4; industrials up 2 at 113.1; papers up 1 at 228.2; golds off .04 at 71.25. Approximate industrial sales were 33,000 shares, an increase of 6,600 over yesterday's total. Mining sales totalled 142,600.

MONTREAL, Jan. 28 — (CP)—58 cattle—receipts continued to be very light. Most of the cattle offered today consisted of cows of common to only medium quality. Prices remained steady with yesterday. Medium cows brought 9.25—10.50 and common kinds 8.25—9.25. Canners and cutters ranged from 6—8. Good bulls sold at 11—12.50 with commoner kinds between 8—10.50.

125 calves—veal calves were in good demand at prices ranging from 18 for common thin light veals to 23 for good kinds. Grass-fed were 10—11 and yearlings 8—9.

51 sheep and lambs—the bulk of the lambs offered were practically all bucks and culls, selling between 15—16. Sheep were 3—8.50 according to quality.

78 hogs—Hogs were steady, selling at 28.50 for grade A and sows mostly 20 dressed.

On the Maritime livestock market Moncton hogs grade A sold at 28.50, B-1, 28.10 and sows number one 20 hot dressed weight delivered. Charlottetown grade A hogs were 27.50, B-1, 27.10 fob country points.
