LOCAL BRIEFS

Latest News of the City and Province.

Rev. Mr. Craie of Mount Stewart will preach at Marie on Sabbath evening, next at 7 o'clock.

CHOIR EXCURSION.—Those who wish to go to the First Methodist choir excursion on Monday evening next had better secure their tickets early as only a limited number will be sold. Tickets may be procured from members of the choir.

On Sunday July 15th the church at Pownal which has been closed several weeks for repairs will be re-opened. There will be three services during the day. At 11 a. m., the Rev. W. J. Howard the present pastor will take his farewell of the congregation. At 3 p. m., the Rev. J. W. McConnell, B. A., will preach, and at 7 p. m., the new pastor Rev. R. Opie, will preach his first sermon. On July 22nd Rev. J. C. Spurr will preach at 11 a. m. Special collections will be taken at all four services towards the paying of expenses.

The work is well done, and there is a blending of colours in paper, paint and general finish which produced pleasant effect. The church as it is to-day is pronounced by competent judges to be among the prettiest country churches on P. E. Island. A very efficient choir, with Mrs. Toombs as organist, added very much to the interest of the services. The Rev. R. Opie who has had the oversight of the church for four years, said good bye to the congregation, but not farewell as his next field of labour will be quite near. A very pleasant and profitable day in the Brackley Point Road Methodist Church, was brought to a close by singing, "God be with you till we meet again," and the benediction.

Since then he has had the extra care and work of a church pastorate.

As previously announced three services were held in the Brackley Point Road Methodist Church last Sunday. Mr. H. R. Vessey preached at 11 a. m., the Rev. J. W. McConnell at 3, and the Rev. R. Opie at 7 p. m. The attendance in the afternoon was lessened by the unfavorable state of the weather, but the service was very much enjoyed by those present. At night the weather had somewhat improved, and the congregation was larger than the enlarged capacity of the church, and many could not get even standing room in the church. The cost of enlarging and improving the church is \$300.00. The collections during the day, nearly met the unprovided for deficiency, and after the service in the evening had closed the small balance was promised, so that the church is free from debt. The following are among the improvements made on the church, viz, 11 1/2 feet added to the length, additional pews, new platform, desk, chairs, and carpet, aisles matted, walls papered, new window shades, new roof, new lamps, three coats of paint on all the new work inside and outside and two coats of paint on the old work inside and outside.

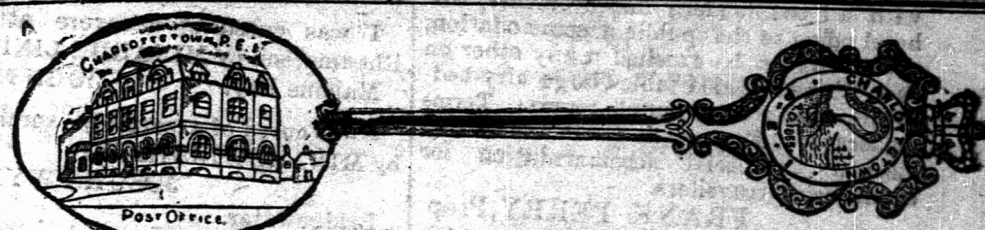
