

INTRODUCTORY DAY OF THE FIREMEN'S TOURNAMENT

Grand Parade of Firemen and Apparatus in the Morning--Excursion to West River in the Afternoon Which was Most Enjoyable--Torchlight Procession in the Evening--Splendid Band Concert in the Public Gardens--Visitors Expressed Themselves As well Pleased With Their Welcome

A crowd that practically blocked street traffic gathered on Queen Street, opposite the Market yesterday morning, where shortly after ten o'clock the street parade started to traverse the principal streets of the City.

My heart welcomes Canadians from the Maritime Provinces. I have not ceased to be a citizen of Charlottetown, although forced for a greater part of the year to live at Ottawa.

I suppose the development of the Fire Department in Charlottetown represents the development of the Fire Departments in other cities. MONCTON, Aug. 1.--(Special)--At a meeting tonight of Manchester Unity, Independent Order of Oddfellows in annual session here the following officers were elected:

REPORTED THAT MUTINY IS OVER

But Public Mind is in Doubt and Great Anxiety is Felt--Fighting at Sveaborg and Near Helsingfors Goes on and Casualties Not Known.

ST. PETERSBURG, Aug. 1. Midnight. (Special)--It is reported here that the mutiny at Sveaborg has been suppressed and that the fortress is again in the hands of the loyal troops, but confirmation is lacking and the public is in doubt of the outcome and intensely anxious.

The casualties transported to Helsingfors number less than fifty, of whom fifteen are dead. But the number killed or wounded in Sveaborg hospitals has not been ascertained.
