Following factories board of cheese: Kensington, 500; Stanley, 217; Winslow, 85; Emerald, 215; Hazelbrook, 75; New Perth, 165; North Wiltshire, 80; Red House, 90; Cornwall, 100; East River, 43. Stanley, Hazelbrook and Cornwall sold to Auld Bros. for 11 3/16. Mr. Peters of the Dairy Division was present and spoke very favorably of the improved condition that Prince Edward Island cheese were reaching their destination in. The following resolution was moved, seconded and duly passed: "Resolved, that this Cheese Board hereby record its appreciation of the result of the attention to shipment of cheese from our Province this season. The improvement has been highly satisfactory. Resolved further that a copy of this resolution be sent to Prof. Kiddick, the Dairy Commissioner, Kensington and New Perth factories paid their board fee.
