THE POWERS AND THE WAR.

Nations like individuals have their friendships and enmities, and these change from time to time. An illustration of this is shown by the changed attitude of Germany and the United States towards Great Britain. Four years ago President Cleveland had brought the United States and Great Britain to the verge of war over the petty Venezuelan question. More recently, when the Kaiser sent his famous telegram to Kruger, things looked very threatening as between Britain and Germany.

Skilful diplomacy avoided a rupture over the South American dispute, and Britain's open friendliness, and her warning to the continental powers to keep "hands off" during the Spanish American War, have brought about full accord between the two great English-speaking nations. It is pleasant to read that the Washington Government, now no longer a thorn in the side of Great Britain, is returning our good offices in the Spanish war and is lending a "moral support" to the Mother Country. This alone would go far toward preventing European complications during the present crisis.

But the precaution was wisely taken by Lord Salisbury and Mr. Chamberlain to effect a thorough and friendly understanding with Germany before the outbreak of war in South Africa. The terms of the agreement are yet profoundly secret, but the fact that an agreement exists is indisputable and admitted. The bitter hostility of the French and Russian press will be offset very shortly by the visit of the German Emperor to the Queen of England, where preparations have been made to give him a right imperial reception. These circumstances give assurance of at least official friendliness on the part of Germany for the time, and render it probable that Britain may be permitted to settle with the Boers without outside interference.

If in the meantime, contrary to present indications, France or Russia or both should provoke war, the British fleet—stronger than their combined forces at sea—is ready for instant action. And in a few months a victorious British army—by that time an army of seasoned veterans—will be ready and half way on their journey to India, or Persia, or wherever they may be most required to meet Russo-French aggressions in the east.

It is said that a section of the railway from Modder River, 30 miles south of Kimberly to Phokwani, 90 miles north of that city—120 miles in all—is being kept open by armored trains. From Modder River southward to Hopetown on the Orange River the railway is in possession of the enemy. This section must be opened up before reinforcements can reach Kimberly.

It is said that the Boer horsemen have so trained their steeds that when their riders dismount the horses will follow their advance, or fall back as required so as to be always within easy reach. This accomplishment is however shown to be outclassed by some of the British cavalry horses. For instance in the Dragoon Guards the horses have been trained to lie down at a word. When the firing becomes hot the dragoon can himself lie flat on the ground, entirely sheltering himself behind the horse and using the saddle as a rest across which to fire. A regiment with horses so trained can ride up within firing distance, dismount, and order their horses to lie down, while they fight from behind their bodies. When hostilities are over the horses rise at the word of command and the regiment can hurry away to another part of the field.

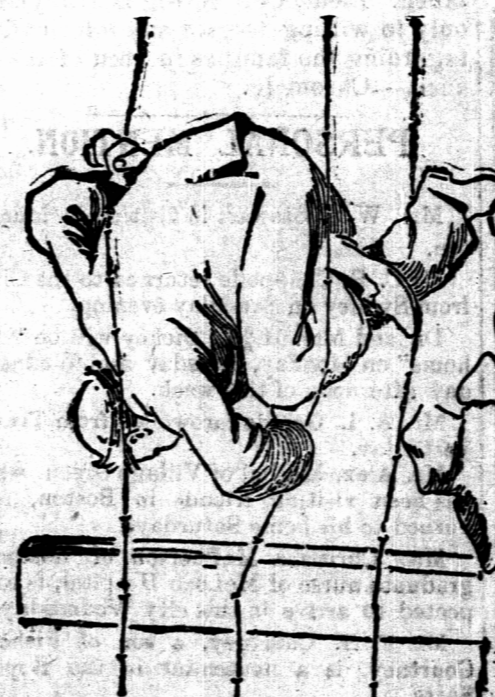
