MONTREAL, Jan. 6 — (CP) — Despite light receipts on the two Montreal livestock markets today, the demand was good and prices held strong. Receipts: 57 cattle, 56 calves, 25 lambs, 158 hogs.

Most of the cattle offered consisted of cows of common to medium quality. Medium cows were 10-11 and common 8.50-9.75. Canners and cutters were 6-8. A few common bulls sold between \$3.00-11.

Vealers ranged from 13-21. Grassers were 10.50-11. A few 11.50.

Lambs were 16.50 and sold flat. Sheep ranged between 4-8.50.

Small butchers were buying grade A hogs at 23.75 with tops at 23 dressed. Packers were still bidding 23.50 for Grade A.

**Stresses Advantage Of British Markets**

TRURO, N. S., Jan. 6 — (CP) — Dr. W. V. Longley, director of extension services for the Nova Scotia Department of Agriculture, said today Canadian producers should continue to supply United Kingdom markets rather than look for the "immediate advantage to be gained from much higher prices in the United States."

He was addressing the annual three-day conference of agricultural extension workers at the Nova Scotia Agricultural College here.

"Britain needs the food and it is up to us, not only to produce it, but to see that the British people are able to obtain it," Dr. Longley said.

He added that the United Kingdom was rebuilding its mercantile fleet, which would eventually enable her to regain a strong economic position.

A panel discussion of department officials agreed that distribution and financial arrangements for payment of agricultural products supplied were the greatest problems facing farmers this year. "Far out-weighting problems of producing volume and quality."

**Large Supply Of Butter In Storage**

WINNIPEG, Jan. 6 — (AP) — Agriculture Minister Gardiner said in an interview here today that Canada had sufficient butter in storage to last more than two months. Mr. Gardiner said because such a commodity as butter can be stored during the winter months, during December more butter went off the market than ever before. "At the present time," he added, "50,000,000 pounds of butter is in storage in Canada."

**London Paper Comments On Food Contracts**

LONDON, Jan. 5 — (Reuters) — The Times said today that both Canada and the United Kingdom are deeply interested in hanging on to the Anglo-Canadian food contracts even though "it is no secret to either that the finding of the means of payment belongs to the nation of hope rather than certainty."

Commenting that the contracts for the supply of Canadian livestock products to Britain go much further than the Anglo-Canadian financial agreement, the Times said in an editorial:

"The contract certainly seems to imply that in the view of both countries payment will be arranged somehow. The Canadian Government's agricultural policy outlines long contracts of sale. The United Kingdom Government's food-importing policy involves long contracts to purchase..."

Referring to the resumption of Anglo-Danish trade talks today, the Times added:

"The prices for livestock products asked previously by the Danish farmers representatives and rejected by the Ministry of Food may not now look too unreasonable. The price asked for bacon, for example, was not significantly higher than that to be paid this year to Canada."

The Daily Graphic, saying that the Anglo-Danish trade talks should produce results, wrote: "Let us take a common-sense view. We do not pay dollars for food from Denmark. The Danes, on their side, may be unwilling to buy where they can not sell. And prices of our exports, too, are going up. "Bluntly we can not afford to be uncompromising about price. We believe the British public would rather pay more for butter and bacon than allow Danish supplies to go elsewhere. "In a world of shortages food is more important than the price we pay for it."
