The Russian Ministry of Finance is offering a series of prizes for inventions relating to the use of alcohol, and covering a varied field of investigation. The various prize offers are as follows: Three prizes of 30,000, 15,000, and 5,000 rubles for a satisfactory method of denaturing alcohol. Three prizes of 60,000, 30,000, and 10,000 rubles for a product derived from alcohol. Three prizes of 50,000, 20,000 and 5,000 rubles for a new method of applying alcohol to the preparation of a product in which it, or its derivatives, constitute a part. Three prizes of 30,000, 15,000, and 5,000 rubles for new methods for the application of alcohol in an industry in which the spirit, or its derivatives, serve as a transitory dissolving agent, or an extracting or
