PARTICULARS OF BISLEY SHOOTING.

BISLEY, July 10.—Today's Kolapore competition was the most exciting in many years. The Canadians were leading when unfortunately Mitchell, for his last shot, got an outer. This raised the hopes of the mother country, who had two shots to go after the Canucks had finished, when Gray, with a bull and Runciman with an inner scored a victory for the mother country by two points.

The total scores in Kolapore cup match was: Britain, 739; Canada, 797; Australia, 779; Guernsey, 775; Malay States, 767; Singapore, 763; South Africa, 751; India, 750.

MRS. ALBERT JONES FOUND ALIVE.

SALISBURY, N. B., July 10.—Search parties which have been scouring the woods at River Glade for a day and a half in search of Mrs. Albert Jones, who left her home at an early hour Thursday morning, were rewarded for their strenuous labors at 12.30 today when she was found in the woods about a mile and a half from her home at Pollet River, near the home of Humbert Smith.

Her father, Mr. Jonah, of Berry's Mills, who was among the party who found her, took her in a carriage and drove her home, and while she was greatly exhausted she was able to walk from the carriage into her home.

Mrs. Jones did not appear to realize what had happened and it is thought that her case was one of temporary mental collapse. Dr. H. A. Jones, of this village, was summoned by telephone and left for River Glade about 1.30 p. m.

It is evident that Mrs. Jones had doubled on her tracks or else traveled in a circle as the woods in which she was found today had been thoroughly searched yesterday. It is a great relief to her friends that she has been found alive as the fear was fast gaining ground that she had fallen into the river or pond.

TROOPS FOR SPRINGHILL.

HALIFAX, July 11.—Judge Patterson of the County Court signed requisition for troops to go to Springhill on account of the disturbances in the strike in the town, and an order was given to send 200 troops.

The train was got ready, and the troops were held in readiness to proceed under Colonel Paves, but for some reason they were held.

Then the Railway got word that the Military train would set out at midnight, but again it was held.

The troops will be dispatched some time to-day. Disturbances were reported at Springhill last night.

NO ELECTIONS THIS YEAR.

WINNIPEG, July 11.—In an address here on Saturday, Sir Wilfrid Laurier denied the report that Dominion elections would be held this year.

MANY DEATHS IN MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, July 11.—The usual high infantile death rate, incident to the hot weather in Montreal has started with a rush, owing to the unusual heat of the past week. Last week there were 240 deaths in the city, as compared with 198 births—a net decrease in population of 42.

Of 240 deaths, 154 were of children under 5 years, most of whom were killed by the bowel complaints incidental to the hot weather and bad food.

Vast majorities of the deaths occurred in the poorer quarters where the intense heat caused great suffering.

ELEVEN DROWNED IN NEW ENGLAND.

BOSTON, July 11.—New England waters claimed eleven lives on the hottest Sunday of the year, in nearly every case the victims were seeking relief from the torrid temperature, by a plunge in the cooling waters.
