TRIAL CHINESE DIVISION TO GO OVER

PEKIN, September 24.—(Delayed)—The president and the cabinet have agreed to the plan of sending a trial division of 24,000 Chinese soldiers to France, if money, equipment and shipping are available. The entente allies have approved the proposition and France is eager to receive the contingent.

The premier is in favor of sending 300,000 men, and the provincial authorities are heartily in support of the plan in the event that the Canton provincial government gives its approval of the war with Germany.

MOTHER HANGS BABIES AND SELF

DETROIT, Sept. 25.—"Take care of the boys; I am leaving you now, so you can be happy," wrote Mrs. Julia Mikola, 28 years old, 2018 St. Aubin Avenue, Hamtramck, in a letter in Hungarian to her husband, and hanged herself and her three little daughters about noon Saturday. The children were Irene, 5 years old; Olga, 3 years old, and Yolanda, 1½ years old.

Her husband, John Mikola, a molder at the Enterprise Foundry Company's plant, 1127-57 East Warren Avenue, admitted to Chief of Police Bernard Whelan, who asked him if he knew how his wife received the blackened eye she had when she was found hanging from the brass chain of an electric fixture in the middle bedroom of their apartment, that he had struck her last Monday morning.

Death may have come quickly to the mother who, after tying a slipknot around her neck with a new pair of shoelaces and fastening them securely to the fixture on which a chandelier had not yet been hung, stepped off a chair. Two of the children were found hanging from hooks in clothes closets and one from the head

CHURCH OPENING SERVICE.

The dedication of the new Baptist House of Worship at Dundas will take place on Sunday, October 7th. Three services will be held in the church on that day; in the morning at 11 o'clock, in the afternoon at 3.00, and in the evening at 7.30. Several visiting speakers will be present to assist the pastor, Rev. R. N. Rand in the dedicatory services, and special music of an appropriate nature will be rendered by the choir. The Baptist congregation of Dundas is to be congratulated on possessing such a splendid new church edifice. The building is of modern architecture with a beautiful and symmetrical tower and Gothic windows. The interior of the building is particularly bright and cheerful, the walls being finished in flat white daintily decorated with gold, while all of the woodwork is of the beautiful Douglas Fir from British Columbia. One of the most pleasing features is the Sunday School and prayer meeting room connecting with the main auditorium. This room is finished entirely with Douglas Fir; in addition to this there are three class rooms and a large ladies' parlor. Mr. A. D. Matheson, the contractor and builder, is deserving of much credit for the efficient manner in which the work has been carried on, and also for the high class of workmanship evinced throughout the building.

DRAFTED MEN NOT LIKELY TO BENEFIT

TORONTO, Sept. 25.—The question as to whether the City of Toronto should insure the "draftees" who will be clothed in khaki by the Military Service Act is likely to cause a keen debate at the City council tomorrow. Civic authorities say "No," and say it emphatically.

Toronto is now putting through \$1,000 insurance claims for slain soldiers at the rate of \$100 a week. This is the highest rate that has been struck yet. It may not be maintained, but for the past week or two the civic authorities have been passing claims at this rapid rate. If that pace were maintained for a year it would mean just \$2,200,000 out of the city's chest. As it is, the city has so far undertaken to insure 42,500 Toronto soldiers—a total risk of \$43,500,000.

Another point that is being urged against insuring drafted men is that the whole purpose of the civic insurance scheme was to encourage voluntary enlistment.

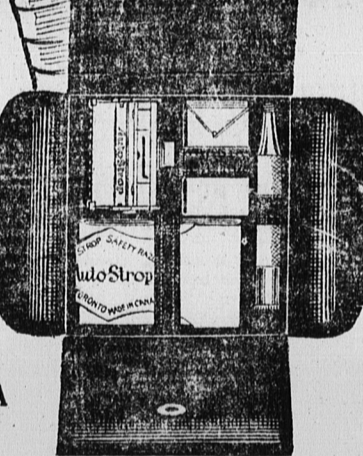

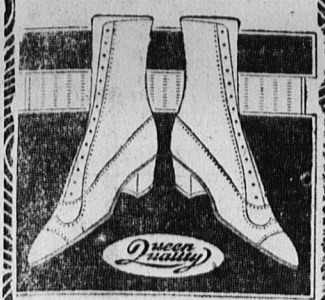
