WELL BID AND PLAYED

South in today's deal displayed good judgment in both the bidding and the play.

West dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

Hand details: ♠ A 5 3, ♠ A 9 4, ♠ 9 8 6 3, ♠ K 5 2, ♠ 8 7 4 2, ♠ 6 5 3 2, ♠ 5 4, ♠ Q 10 6, ♠ Q 10, ♠ Q 10 7, ♠ K Q 2, ♠ A J 9 8 4.

The bidding: West Pass, North Pass, East Pass, South Pass.

South was silent on the first round because he did not want to get 'caught in between' with a two-club overcall.

When, however, it developed that North, not West, had the 'balance of power,' South showed his strength by jumping to two no-trump.

West decided to lead his partner's second bid, spades. Dummy played low; East won and returned the same suit.

South declared led a diamond from the board and won with the king when East ducked.

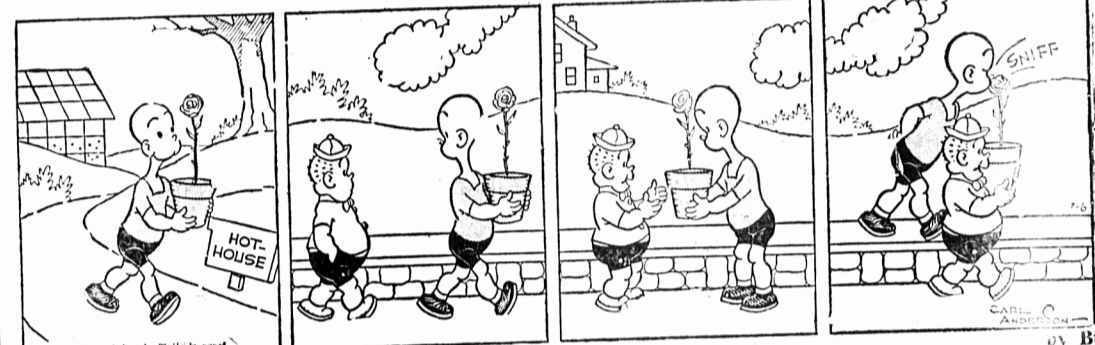

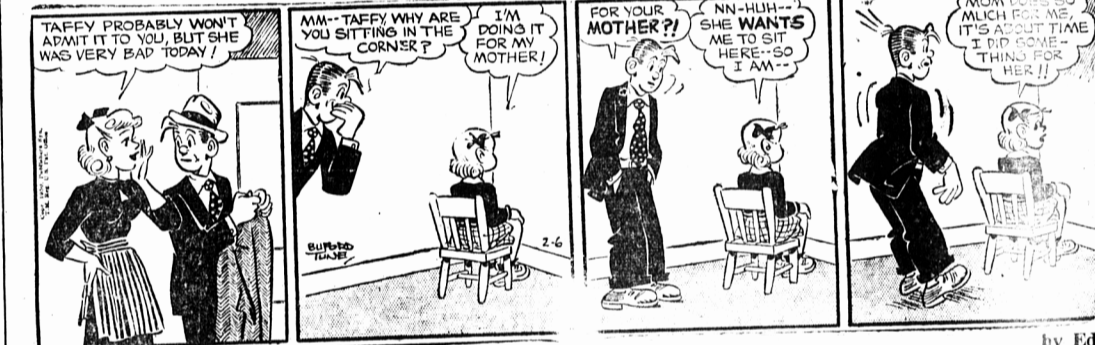

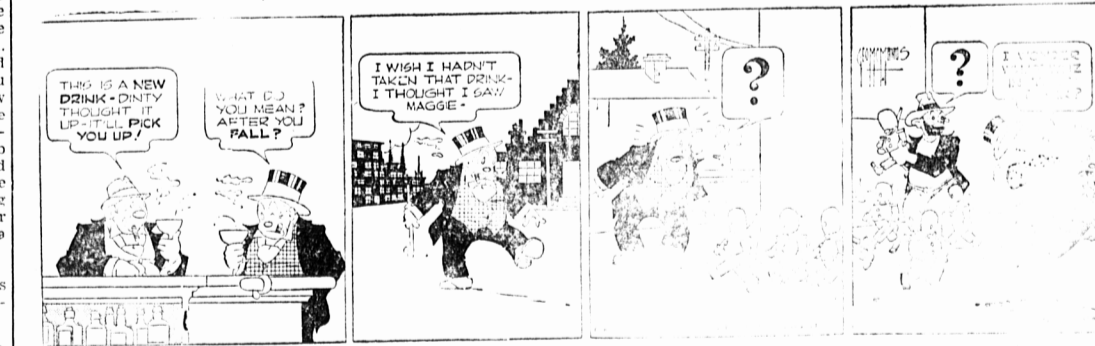
