Stocks Show Recovery Trend At New York

(By Victor Eubank, Associated Press Financial Writer)

NEW YORK, Jan. 14 (AP)—Stocks enjoyed a slow-going and selective recovery shift today although many market leaders remained in losing territory.

The ticker tape loaded after a fairly active opening. Steels, motors, rails and a number of industrial edged up in fractions to a point or more. Extreme gains were reduced in most cases at the close.

The Associated Press 30-stock composite was up 2 at a point at 6:41 after three successive dips totalling 2.6 points.

Canadian stocks were mixed. Hiram Walker and Distillers Seagram each lost 1-8 and McIntyre 1-2. On the curb, Lake Shore gained 1-8 and Giant Yellow Knife slipped 1-8.

Estiman Kodak up 3 points on an initial transaction following a drop of 7 1-2 Monday ended with a net gain of 1 1-4 at 216 1-4. Santa Fe added 1 at 89 1-4. Twentieth Century-Fox 1 1-4 at 32 5-8. Southern Pacific 7-8 at 41 3-4. Transcontinental and Western Air 3-4 at 19 3-8 on a new financing program. Woodworth 3-4 at 59 and Du Pont 1 at 183.

Medat. plus gains were retained by U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Chrysler, United Aircraft, Douglas Aircraft, International Harvester, North American, Electric Power and Light, Great Northern, Southern Railway, Baltimore and Ohio, American Smelting and Westinghouse, Schenley, Sears Roebuck, Texas Co. and Paramount Pictures.

Johns-Manville was off 3 at 127 on 309 shares. Allied Chemical conceded 2 at 170 on 200 shares and Owens-Illinois 1 1-2 at 75 1-4. Lesser recessions were shown for Montgomery Ward, Western Union, "A," Standard Oil (N.Y.) Union Carbide, General Electric, American Can, Kennecott, J. C. Penney and U. S. Gypsum.

Improved Tone On Montreal Exchange

MONTREAL, Jan. 14 (CP)—The final tone was generally improved on the stock exchange and curb market today following the trading pattern of the New York and Toronto markets. Fractional losses were evenly distributed. Papers and metals rallied in late trading to cut down losses suffered in yesterday's decline. Turnover was lighter than the previous session.

Donnacona made the best recovery in papers with a 1-3-4 point gain while St. Lawrence Paper Preferred, St. Lawrence Corporation Common and Preferred and M. and O. closed ahead after opening with slight losses. International lost an early rise and Abitibi Preferred offset a previous slip. Still lower were Consolidated, Price, Abitibi Common, Bathurst "A", Dryden, Howard Smith, Eddy and B. C. Forest.

In the liquor list, the interrelated companies lagged and Montreal retrieved a loss in utilities. Bell was steady and Quebec Power dropped a gain. Royal was off 5-8 in banks and C.P.R. and Canada Steamships down in carriers.

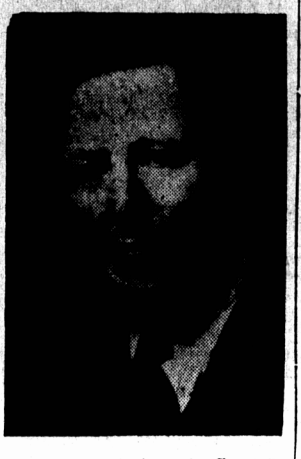
Winners in industrials were D. Bridge, Canadian Industries, Page Hersey, Canadian Vickers Common and Preferred, Algoma and Cock-shutt lost early push-ups. Weaker were Massey, Doco "B", Aveling, Gypsum and Hamilton Bridge. Electroflux erased a loss. Ogilvie and Lake of the Woods were softer in milling.

Nickel and smelters converted their earlier losses to gains and Hudson Bay and Aluminum retreated. McColl and B. A. were softer in oils.

East Sullivan, Normetal and Westville were gainers and Sheritt, MacDonald, Formanque and Jack Lake losers in the mines section.

In the miscellaneous list, Acceptance and Consolidated Lithograph moved higher and Famous Players was off 1-2.

Price Advance On Paper Products

OTTAWA, Jan. 13 (CP)—Following lifting of ceiling prices on certain grades of pulps, papers and paper board and on all converted paper products, the Price Board today announced a 10 per cent increase in prices for all other types of pulp and paper products except newsprint.

Newsprint was suspended from price control last May 1 to manufacturers, but remains under price control when sold by distributors.

In making the announcement, Donald Gordon, Prices Board chairman, said adjustments being made give recognition to increases in wages, labor and other operating costs and reduce the gap between domestic and foreign prices.

Items affected are principally products which enter into manufacturing and business costs and the board estimated that the price increase would not have much effect on the price of consumer goods.

Celling prices for waste paper also have been adjusted slightly to meet higher costs to sorters and packers. This increase in prices does not affect the distribution controls of waste paper which continue in effect to ensure supplies for certain mills and to the in with woodpulp allocations.

CLOVE OIL SALES

ZANZIBAR — (CP)—Exports of clove oil from Zanzibar Protectorate last year totalled a record 325,313 pounds, said the annual report of the department of agriculture. Sales were mainly to the United Kingdom, and also to the United States and Australia.
