SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy, either brother or sister of intending homesteader. DATES.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section homestead. Price \$20 per acre. DATES.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption land in each of six years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) or cultivate fifty acres extra. A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain pre-emption, may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$20 per acre of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house or other building. W. W. DORY
