#### BUTTER AND WATER.

In 1897 the Dominion Parliament passed the Butter Act which is now the law of the land. Sections 3 and 4 of this Act provide:

"No person shall manufacture or import into Canada, or offer, sell, or have in his possession for sale any butter containing over sixteen per cent of water."

"No person shall mix with butter any acid, alkali, chemical, or any substance whatever, which is introduced for the purpose or with the effect of causing the butter to absorb water or any part of milk or cream."

The penalty for violation of section 3 is "not exceeding \$100 and not less than \$20," and for violating section 4 is "not exceeding \$50 nor less than \$10, with costs of prosecution."

It is quite clear that if an individual or a creamery makes and sells over 110 pounds of butter from milk not containing more than 100 pounds of butter fat, they are selling water for butter, contrary to law, and are subject to the penalties laid down in the law. And it is a gross wrong upon the consumer to sell him water for butter, especially when butter is worth 25 cents a pound—every pint of water sold for a quarter of a dollar.

It is quite possible that some honest persons are unwittingly offending in this matter, not knowing the law and not realising the wrong they are doing. It is morally certain, however, that much of butter sold in Charlottetown contains a good deal more than the legal percentage of water.

It is told of Alexander Muir, who died the other day in Toronto that he expended \$30 on the publication of his famous song, "The Maple Leaf Forever," and got back only \$1. But fame counts for something.

Now the people of Alberta and Saskatchewan are complaining that the census of those Provinces just now taken only enumerates those persons who have been six months in the country. The heavy influx of settlers this year will not be counted. But it is fair enough after all. It is the permanent rather than the floating population that it is desirable to ascertain, and in new countries there is often a large floating element.

The Nova Scotia Legislature at a recent session enacted a law similar to that for some years in operation in New Brunswick requiring jail prisoners to work and pay for their maintenance. It is an excellent law, just and equitable, but some prisoners in Sydney jail mutinied against it when ordered out to work on the roads. They were thirteen in number, and as punishment for their refusal each was strapped by one arm to the jail fence and put on a diet of bread and water. They held out for one day and then concluded to put on the striped suits and go to work. No form of punishment seems better calculated to keep a lazy loafer or tramp out of jail than to make him work.

Even after the vigorous party white-washing the Arctic supply affair does not look entirely clean.

Canada's expenditure this year is provided for at the rate of eight millions a month. At the beginning of the Dominion it was one million a month.

In response to the petitions for improved train service and the carriage of the mails on the Murray Harbor Railway Hon. Mr. Emmerson has written Alder Brehaut: "It would be my desire to give adequate train service. The question raised by your petition leads me to doubt the efficiency of the train now operated in the interest of passenger traffic."
