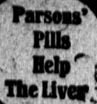

THE INWARD TRAINS.—Yesterday the eastern express arrived in Charlottetown at 9.35 a. m., five minutes late; the eastern accommodation at 5.55 p. m., fifteen minutes late; the western accommodation at 11.45 a. m., five minutes late; the Cape Traverse at 10.15 a. m., twenty minutes late and the Murray Harbor at 11.05 a. m., an hour and five minutes late.

WILL PROBATED.—The will of the late Mr. Hugh Monaghan, Charlottetown, was probated yesterday. The estate is valued at \$113,798.64. The sum of \$7,000 is left for religious and charitable purposes, the remainder to the sons and daughter of the deceased, as follows: To Patrick, in Bath, Maine, \$5,000; to Michael and James an annuity of \$260 each for life, the residue, to his daughter Miss Mary Ann. Among the special bequests are \$2,000 for masses for the repose of the soul of the deceased, his wife and members of the family and \$5,000 to St. Dunstan's Cathedral building fund. The real estate is valued at \$26,850 and is situated in Charlottetown and Royalty. Among the principal properties in Charlottetown are the brick store occupied by Messrs. Prowse Bros, Ltd., the stores and lands occupied by Messrs. Carter & Co., and Alley & Co., and some other properties.
