BURKE GOES TO OTTAWA FOR STARR FORUM, Montreal, Feb. 14.—(By The Canadian Press)—Ifo Danburand, managing-director of Les Canadiens of the National Hockey League announced that Marty Burke, Canadiens defence man for the past four seasons, had been traded to Ottawa Senators in a straight exchange for Harold Starr and Leo Bourgeault.

Harold Starr is a defence man, a sturdy checker and a fast rusher. Bourgeault is also a defence man. The new defence men will play with the Red Shirts against the Senators in Ottawa on Thursday.

Beyond the acquisition of a complete new defence duo, Danburand had no announcement to make. There was a possibility, he said, that Johnny Gagnon might figure in some other deal when the Canadiens reached Ottawa.
