A Limerick is a little poem of five lines of peculiar measure, telling a short story, the interest of which usually culminates in the fifth line. In the competition four lines are given and competitors are asked to supply the fifth line and so complete the story and the Limerick. A good fifth line should be sprightly, or witty, or should give a comical or unexpected turn to the story, or it may supply humorous comment upon or reason for one or more of the facts stated in the four usually preceding lines. The Limerick is not usually a very high order of poetry, but a Limerick competition is nonetheless calculated to sharpen the wits of competitors and give them exercise in rhyming and phrasing. The ambition of those competing ought to be not so much to win a prize, as to produce bright thoughts, express them cleverly and so improve themselves. Care should be taken that the line supplied shall connect properly with the four printed lines. No fewer than thirty-five of the competitors in last week's contest made the mistake of beginning with the word "but." Had they looked to the connection they would have noticed that the fourth line began with "but," and they would not have "budded in" with an inelegant repetition.
