M. McTigue May Yet Agree With Jacobs

RICKARD SUCCEEDS IN BRIDGING THE GAP BETWEEN FIGHTER AND MANAGER, MIKE WILL MEET STRIBLING

NEW YORK, Dec. 26.—A final effort is being made by promoters to bridge the gap between light-heavyweight champion Mike McTigue and his manager, Joe Jacobs. If they are successful in their efforts there is little doubt but that Mike will meet the winner of the Young Stribling-Dave Rosenberg twelve-round battle which is to be held in the 1st Regiment Armory at Newark, N.J., on New Year's Day at 3 p.m.

McTigue desires to wipe out the stigma caused by the draw decision he received in his bout with the sensational Southerner in Atlanta, Ga. It was through this affair that Stribling jumped into fame, and if manager and Stribling's ability to meet the New York State Boxing Commission's age requirements had not intervened they would have surely met in New York before this.

Rosenberg considers himself lucky to get the bout with Stribling as he figures that a victory over the Southerner will further his bid for lost honors. He is putting more into his training than when he was preparing to defend the world's middleweight championship which was once his.

Tommy Gibbons to Fight Carpenter

MINNEAPOLIS CLUB PLAN TO STAGE OPEN-AIR BOUT BETWEEN LIGHT-HEAVYWEIGHTS IN SUMMER

MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Dec. 26.—Tommy Gibbons, St. Paul's popular light-heavyweight, who gained world-wide recognition on July 4th by staying fifteen rounds with Champion Jack Dempsey, will meet Georges Carpenter, of France, in an open-air bout in Minneapolis next summer under the auspices of the Hennipen Athletic Association.
