RUSSIA'S BALTIC FLEET.

The more closely they are examined the more problematical appear the prospects of Russia's fleet proceeding to the far east. The Japanese claim to have information that this fleet is frozen in and cannot move, and this may be true, as its winter quarters in the Gulf of Riga is in latitude 58, where navigation except for specially fitted ice breakers like the famous Ermaek, must be extremely difficult if not impossible at this season of the year. But even if the fleet were free from its ice barriers, the distance from Riga to Port Arthur by way of the Suez Canal is 12,200 miles.

To cover that distance 250 miles a day would be a fair rate of speed for warships that must keep together and that must also economize their fuel. Some allowance should also be made for detention on account of stress of weather or accident. But even without allowance from these causes it would take fifty days for these ships to complete the journey. That would carry forward the date of their arrival to April 13. But possibly judging from the present outlook that might be too late.

In a war which has opened with such vigor and destruction many things must needs happen before the date above named. And should complications arise that would force Britain into the struggle the Baltic fleet might be much safer in the Baltic than in the North Sea, the Atlantic or the Mediterranean, through whose waters it must needs pass on the way to the far east. There are many matters that must be weighed very carefully by the Czar and his councillors before he sends out his Baltic fleet from its home port to take chances on so long, and possibly so perilous a voyage as that from Riga to Port Arthur.
