THE BELFAST AND FORT AUGUSTUS CONTESTS.

The Guardian would have much preferred that a provincial election should now be in preparation instead of the two bye-elections in Belfast and Fort Augustus.

The Legislature is now divided between fourteen Liberals and fourteen Conservatives, with two vacant seats. Should the Government hold both seats it would restore the Premier and Attorney General to his place in the House and give him a voting majority of one before the Speaker.

Should the Opposition succeed in carrying only one of the two seats, a practical deadlock would exist, and a general election would become imperative.

This fact imposes a double responsibility upon the electors of Port Augustus and Belfast. They will be voting not merely for local representatives, but to decide important matters for the entire Province.

ten in these columns the general principle has been stated that both the Province and the Dominion have made the mistake of keeping their Governments too long.

But the welfare of the Province must outweigh any mere personal considerations. There are great issues to be grappled with, of transportation, of education, of our depleted and wasted oyster fisheries, of our long succession of provincial deficits, of reform in our voting system.

The electors of the two districts should be promptly and fully advised as to what the Government proposes to do in regard to these matters. Things cannot go on as they have been going.

THE HUDSON BAY ROUTE.

The trip of the Government steamer Minto to Hudson Bay is full of suggestiveness as to the prospective value of the proposed northern sea route for an outlet to the Northwest Provinces.

No attempts were made to make a

quick trip, and the steamer appears to have rendered good service in towing and assisting other vessels on the way going and returning.

What are the prospects of shipping grain profitably by that route under the conditions disclosed? The season is obviously limited to two or three months. Ordinary steamers used in carrying grain would be unsafe among the bergs and fields of ice.

It looks as though the Government of Canada is committed to an enormously costly and perhaps wholly impracticable scheme in undertaking to open the Hudson Bay route.

COMPULSORY SEWERAGE CONNECTION.

Our correspondent "Citizen" calls attention to what seems a very important matter. We have an excellent trunk system of sewerage in Charlottetown, but it fails to render the service required because a large proportion of the dwellings, especially in the poorer parts of the city have not made connection therewith.

It is also notorious that sanitary inspection either is not as efficient as it ought to be, or if the inspector is attended to, the enforcement of the cleaning-up process has been neglected.
