Crop Report

Below will be found a brief synopsis of telegraphic reports received at the Head Office of the Bank of Montreal from its branches. The Branch Managers have complete and intimate knowledge of each local situation and are in close touch with crop conditions in all sections of the districts shown. The map overleaf indicates the approximate extent of the districts mentioned:

MARITIME PROVINCES. Reports from the Maritime Province indicate that the prolonged drought has adversely affected all wheat. Hay crop light, probably 50 percent of an average. Cereals generally below average. Roots and grass pastures have benefited by recent rains. Fruit prospects are average. In Prince Edward Island hay is nearly an average crop, cereals are ripening and harvest will be early. Roots, rather below average. Fruit prospects fair.

PRAIRIE PROVINCES
EDMONTON DISTRICT. wheat and oats promise good average crops, hay lighter than usual. Plenty moisture, no damage reported.

CALGARY DISTRICT. whole district visited by rains which though helpful were too late to be of much benefit; fair to average crop expected north part of district but in south crop light.

LETHBRIDGE DISTRICT. heat of past two weeks will lower yields; heavy rains in south district and some hail. Late grains are profiting by rains and there is no danger of a feed shortage; grain crops estimated at two thirds of last year's crop.

REGINA DISTRICT. prospects above average with continuing favorable conditions, except in the extreme west where drought damage is heavy; late wheat crop will suffer somewhat from rust and sawfly, oats, rye and flax promise well.

cool weather has made good crop growing conditions; heavy scattered hail losses; wheat expected to average fifteen bushels, poor crops in certain districts, but in immediate Saskatoon districts conditions good. Out crop and pasture good.

WINNIPEG DISTRICT. considerable damage has been done by heat and rust and crops are spotty; somewhat better than average crop expected but oats and barley will be light; harvesting has started and will be general throughout the west in from ten to fifteen days.

PROVINCE OF QUEBEC. The hay crop, except in the Abitibi and Lake St. John Districts, will be very light and in some districts almost a failure. Recent rains have helped the growth of cereals but crops generally will be below average. Roots are in fair condition and grass pasture has benefited by recent rains, but more moisture is still needed.

PROVINCE OF ONTARIO. Conditions in most districts are favorable for a good general yield. Harvesting mostly finished. There are or four weeks earlier than usual. Fall wheat a good average crop. On the whole other grains a fair yield. Hay generally has been light, but there will be no shortage of feed as an exceptional large yield of corn will offset the shortage in oats and hay. Grass pasture and roots have been improved by recent rains. Apples light crop; small fruits, cherries, plums, pears good. Tobacco and early tomatoes doing exceptionally well.

PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA. Weather generally hot and dry. Grain cutting has commenced and good average crop is expected. Roots continue satisfactory, though Kootenay districts reports lack of moisture. Potatoes are commencing to move, prospects excellent. Hops promise 100 per cent yield. Apples now making first appearance and quality excellent. Other fruit, making good headway. Over 100 percent crop predicted in Okanagan.

SEPARATE COCK BIRDS FROM HENS

As soon as the breeding season has passed, pen the cock birds away from the hens. Make a separation of cock birds to be used in the breeding pens next season and sell or cook the rest. Great losses in eggs are estimated each year due to the exposure of heat to fertile eggs. Heat develops the germ of the fertile egg and within a few days the egg is unfit for food.

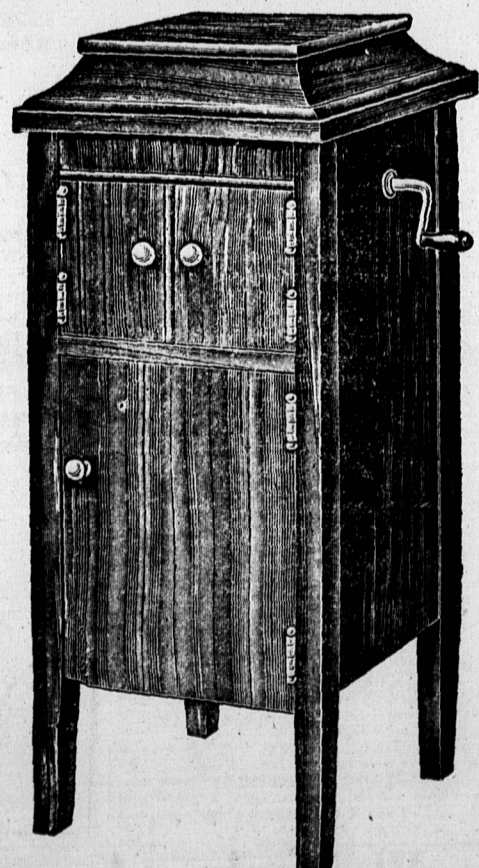
