

RE-UNION OF 105TH BATTALION

By Battalion Order No. 306 of 28th November 1916 a draft of sixty men to the 26th Nova Scotia Battalion and a draft of one hundred and thirty nine men to 13th Montreal Highlanders were struck off strength of the Battalion for service in France. By Battalion order No. 113 of 5th December a further draft of 120 men were struck off the strength for service in France with the 14th Montreal Battalion. This was the beginning of the end, and it was then seen that there was no hope of getting to France at a unit.

In Battalion Order No. 24 of 24th January 1917 the following are listed as being in the 104th and 105th Battalions, Canadian Infantry will be amalgamated into one Infantry Battalion with effect 22nd January 1917, and will be designated as the 104th Battalion, Canadian Infantry. Commanding Officers concerned will take necessary steps to carry out this amalgamation forthwith. Lieut. Colonel A. E. Ings, 105th Battalion assumes command of the 104th Battalion 22nd January 1917.

Thus the Island Battalion which had both at Valcartier Camp and in England won unstinted praise from Inspecting Officers passed out of existence. The remaining personnel of the Battalion being divided, some went to the 104th Battalion and some to 13th New Brunswick Reserve Battalion.
