Of 390 Boxes So Far Examined Hearst Has Gained 188.

NEW YORK, June 11.—William R. Hearst made good gains today in the recount of the ballots in the disputed mayoralty election of 1906, the examination of ninety-nine ballots during the day giving Mr. Hearst a net gain of fifty-three votes. Three hundred and ninety boxes have been examined in the proceedings before Justice Lambert, and Mr. Hearst has gained 188 votes.
