**R. C. A. F. To Use Jets In Winter War Exercises**

OTTAWA, Sept. 26 — (CP) — The R.C.A.F. is planning to turn its first two regular jet fighter squadrons loose over the northern snows in January in joint Canadian-American war games that are a sequel to the controversial, all-Canadian Exercise Eagle.

It was Air Force equipment — the number of transport planes, use of Harvard trainers, absence of jets — which provoked the bulk of press criticism of Eagle, unfolded along the first 50 miles of the Alaska Highway in August.

Just what the R.C.A.F. will have in Exercise Cross-Index, based at Whitehorse, Yukon, is expected to include Canada's first to peacetime regular interceptor fighter squadrons and their Vampire jets. One is in existence and based at Montreal. The other is expected to be formed shortly.

Active preparations for the exercise already are under way around Whitehorse. Alaska-based American jet planes are reported in that area and American and Canadian engineers are getting accommodation in shape for hundreds of men.

It will show something of the ability of the two countries to cooperate in a military action that would be really if an enemy ever attacked this continent.

**Noronic Survivors Declare Captain Completely Sober**

DETROIT, Sept. 27 — (CP) — Two survivors of the Noronic steamship fire said today that the Noronic's master, Capt. William Taylor of Sarnia, Ont., was completely sober during the blaze which gutted the Canada Steamship Lines cruise ship at Toronto.

They testified at a coroner's inquest into the Sept. 17 disaster, which left some 130 persons dead or missing.

In a similar inquiry last week at Cleveland, O., C. E. Wilson, a survivor, charged that the Captain was drunk during the fire, but other survivors said he acted in a normal manner.

At Toronto, Capt. Taylor denied Mr. Wilson's allegation.

At least two survivors said without qualification today that Capt. Taylor was in full possession of his faculties and that he did his utmost to save his ship and her passengers.

A total of 32 Detroit and district survivors of the fire that destroyed the Canada Steamship Lines ship testified before Coroner S.G. Gerber of Cleveland. Dr. Gerber also conducted the Cleveland probe.

Few witnesses today made any mention of help being given by members of the crew and all said there was no fire alarm sounded. Others contended fire equipment aboard the boat was inadequate.

Leo Papp said he saw Capt. Taylor about 20 minutes before the fire and that there was "nothing unusual about the Captain's appearance."

Dallas Condon said he was sure "Captain Bill" was sober the night of the blaze.

Miss Ethel Clawson testified she saw a ship's maid smoking in the boat's linen room but could not remember whether it was the day of the fire or earlier.

Miss Deaally agreed among those testifying that the fire was noticed about 2:30 A.M. EDT and that the first indication of something wrong was a rapid knock on a stateroom door or, in a few cases, the smell of smoke.

**Discuss Wildlife Research Plans**

OTTAWA, Sept. 26 — (CP) — Representatives of wildlife interests in Eastern North America met here today to discuss research plans for the coming year.

Dr. Harrison Lewis, chief of the Wildlife Branch of the Resources Department, was host at the informal discussions, designed mainly to co-ordinate waterfowl research and minimize overlapping of effort.

Attending the meeting were representatives from Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Prince Edward Island, Ontario, Quebec, Ducks Unlimited and the Wildlife Institute of Washington. New Brunswick was not represented since it operates the northeastern wildlife station at Fredericton and is in close touch with authorities here, Dr. Lewis said.

**Home of "Healers" Closed To Pilgrims**


QUEBEC, Sept. 26 — (CP) — The house in St. Sylvester, Lower St. Lawrence County, which for some months has been a "pilgrims' Mecca" has been closed to the public, it was announced today.

Amee Belanger, father of nine children, four of whom gained reputations as "healers," issued a notice that his house has been closed to the public "until further orders." Last week Archbishop Maurice Roy of Quebec advised Roman Catholics to "abstain" from pilgrimages to the Belanger farmhouse.

**4,000 Idle In B.C. Fishermen's Strike**

VANCOUVER, Sept. 26 — (CP) — The worst tie-up in British Columbia's fishing history today left 4,000 fishermen and plant workers idle and threatened to put another 2,500 on the jobless list within a week.

In addition, hundreds of can and box makers will be affected, industry spokesmen said.

The "cease-fishing" order was given by the United Fishermen and Allied Workers' Union (A.F. L.-I.L.O.) following a membership vote over chum salmon prices. Union secretary Home Stevens said the men voted "by an overwhelming majority" to take action Saturday night.

The union had rejected an operators' offer of an 8 1/2-cent-a-pound minimum for chums in some areas, and 5 1/2 to 5 3/4 in others. The fishermen asked 10% and 6 cents.
