NO AERIAL MAIL SERVICES.—Mr. F. W. Hyndman has received a message from the Royal Flying Corps headquarters Toronto, expressing regret that an aeroplane could not be sent to Moncton to carry the mails over to the island.

HOCKEY CHALLENGE.—The Commercial travellers at the Revere Hotel challenge the commercial travellers at the Victoria Hotel to a friendly game of hockey to be played tonight in the Arena Rink. Mr. George Lane is Captain of the Revere Hotel team.

TRACTORS DISPOSED OF.—Of the six Ford tractors to be brought here by the Provincial Department of Agriculture, one is to be placed on the Falconwood Farm, and the others sold to individual farms. Mr. Clark of the Dominion Experimental Farm is procuring a Moline tractor.

THE S. S. STANLEY.—The Halifax Herald says that the Stanley has been to the eastward picking up boys which had gone adrift in the ice. This was the first time since she started out on her winter's work that the Stanley's services were not given to ice breaking.

LEGISLATORS DETAINED.—The province will not be represented by its full quota of four members at the next session of the Dominion Parliament, which meets on Monday, unless something unforeseen happens. While the re-count proceedings are on Mr. Sinclair, of Queen's cannot take his seat. Messrs. Donald Nicholson, M. P. and James McIsaac, M. P. have been detained in the city on account of the heavy storms. An attempt was to have been made to drive by team to Borden but this plan was abandoned. Capt. Joseph Read, M. P., for Prince, drove by team from Summerside to Borden and will probably make the journey in time. Senators MacLennan, Murphy, Yeo, and Prowse are also detained in the province.

Cecil Urges Japanese To Take Action

LONDON, March 13.—Pointing out the seriousness of the German menace in Siberia and in Southern Asia, Cecil Urges Japanese intervention and insisting that the German people afford no hope of rising against their imperialistic masters. Lord Robert Cecil, minister of blockade, pointed out in a statement to the Associated Press what had already been accomplished by the Germans in the East.

Spreading a large map on the table, Lord Robert said: "Look at what Germany has already done toward the north she has taken rich Baltic provinces over which she purposes to install a German prince. She sent troops to Finland and concluded an agreement which puts the whole foreign policy of Finland at her disposal. These steps in the north have practically cut off Russia from access to the sea."

Will Take Odessa

"Looking further south, we find that Germany is in the course of occupying Odessa, the greatest Black Sea port, and that she has insisted that Russia cede to Turkey all ports at the east end of the Black Sea. Her evident design is to substitute for the Berlin-Bagdad railroad a new avenue to the East by trans-Caucasia and northern Persia. In the execution of
