United States Pressing Claim

WASHINGTON, Mar. 28.—The American Government has sent to the Allied Powers another note supplemental to that recently despatched and destined to support Village Green on Jan. 30th, 1922, its claim for equality with the other Powers in the payment of costs arising from the Rheims occupation.

The note in words characterized by one official as "plain if not diplomatic" notifies the Allied Governments that no judging of the United States costs will determine it as a just claim.

The note is a sequel to a recent despatch from the United States Government made in mistake in saying that France had been paid in full and the supplemental note delivered today was designed to forestall any such suggestion.

WEST CANADA MINES TO CEASE

CALGARY, Alta., March 23.—A cessation of work in all mines in District 18 of the United Mine Workers of America, comprising Alberta and Eastern British Columbia, will take place on April 1, according to a statement made by Robert Elliott, international board member, after receiving a letter from the Western Canada Coal Operators' Association last night. As a result of their special meeting yesterday, the operators notified the Minister of Labor that they had selected W. W. McNeill, of the Workmen's Compensation Board, to act as their representatives on the board of conciliation, also that they refuse absolutely to pay the present scale of wages, but will pay rates now posted at their mines to come into effect on April 1, pending an announcement of the board's finding.

The situation now rests with the Minister of Labor. The operators have forwarded their letter to him and provided a chairman can be speedily agreed upon, the investigation may commence within the next few days.
