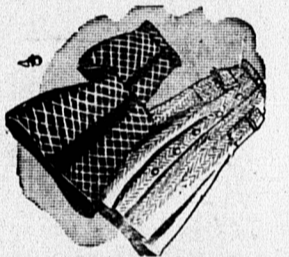

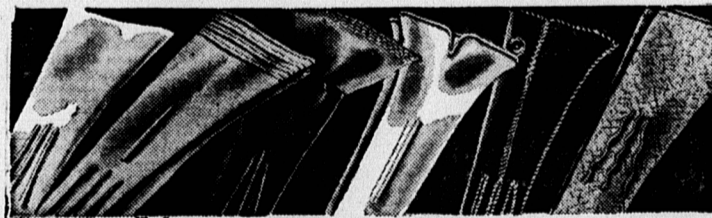

Beauty By The Week

MONDAY: Skin day! Give your skin five minutes extra attention at night. Cleanse thoroughly, working the cleansing cream right into the skin with the pads of the fingers, going very gently round the eyes. Wipe off with tissues. Now take a skin tonic, dampen a piece of cotton-wool with it, and slap vigorously over the face. Press well to the corners of nose and mouth, centre chin, and places where there is a tendency to grease. Apply nourishing cream—yes, even greasy skins need this! Do not wipe off for ten minutes, then remove surplus.

TUESDAY
Feet! Soak well in hot water, dry thoroughly and anoint with eau-de-Cologne. Take a cuticle solvent and go round the nails as you would with your hands. Your feet do as much work as your hands and get half the care; it isn't fair. Apply cuticle solvent to any corns and go over them with an orange stick. Pare off hard skin with a safety razor blade, being very careful not to draw blood. If you do draw blood by mistake, touch with iodine at once. Remove

all hard skin. Powder thoroughly and massage the toes.

WEDNESDAY

Hands. This evening soak the nails after filling them into shape. Go round the cuticles, with remover, and then clip off any jagged pieces—never cut the cuticles, as this hardens them. See that you do this work in a good light. Tip under the nails with a white pencil, and varnish with a lightish varnish—the deep colors are dead out. Use a good nourishing cream for the hands themselves and just for tonight do sleep in gloves.

THURSDAY

Eyes tonight, please. An eye

bath and a few simple exercises to ease strain. Place the palms lightly over your eyes and try to see black! This isn't easy, you will find, and if you see grey it means that you need this particular exercise. Have a hundred blinks. Now roll your eyes six times in big circles to the right, then the other way. Apply eye pads of cotton wool soaked in a good lotion and let them lie on for as long as you can. That is specially important if you work a lot in artificial light.

FRIDAY

What about your hair tonight? Two hundred strokes of the brush, then damp it lightly with eau-de-cologne, and pin into ring curls,

the tinner the better. Put a net over the whole thing, and sleep that way. Shampoo once a fortnight and use the shampoo which suits you best. Choose a simple style—nothing elaborate or it'll get out of hand. Remember that healthy hair is always beautiful and the secrets of healthy hair are cleanliness and constant brushing to promote the proper distribution of natural grease.

SATURDAY

You may think your neck doesn't need care, but it does. If it has gone dark and dirty-looking, treat it to a bleaching pack. Scrub with a complexion brush to remove collar marks which come in the winter to the back of the neck.

Feed with cream, slapping it in under the chin with the back of the hand. Here is an exercise to keep the chin-line. Clasp your hands behind the head and push it as hard as you can forwards and downwards, resisting the pressing by pushing your head back against the clasped hands.

SUNDAY

A leisurely day. Have a face pack, and any special treatments you haven't had time for before. Oatmeal treatment if yours is a greasy skin, oil treatment if a dry one. Do any pet exercises. Pluck the eyebrows, using 1 oz. eau-de-cologne to prevent the pain. Give yourself a face massage, using the finger tips, and working upwards

all the time. Make little circles at eye corners very lightly, and harder circles where your teeth meet inside your cheek. Work across the nose to lip corner lines, and upwards between the brows.

British Pound Continues Slide On Money Mart

NEW YORK March 15 (AP)—The British pound weakened further today in a foreign market still

shadowed by recently announced restrictions on the use of free sterling.

Despite a new drop of 1-4 cents in the pound, however, exchange dealers said there were indications the sharp slide of the past week or more might be leveling off. The final price of \$3.70 3-4 in terms of United States funds, was a full cent above the day's low. The Canadian dollar, along with other currencies in the sterling bloc fell back. A loss of 1-4 cent put the price at 81 3-4 cents in United States money. Ottawa foreign exchange control board rate 9.08-9.91 pc. discount. The French franc lost .01 1-2 of 4 to 210 The Be'ra and Swiss franc struck against this trend with minor gains. The guilder dipped .01 of 4 cent.
