### WILD DOE HELPED TO TAKE CARE OF FAWN

NEW LONDON, Oct. 27—An incident in animal life which possibly may never be duplicated occurred a few weeks ago on the estate of George W. Watson, at Eastern Point. Soon after Mr. Watson arrived at his Eastern Point residence a fawn was born in the grass land around the residence. During the winter of course there was nothing to disturb the deer and they wandered at will around the estate. When it was time to cut the grass a mowing machine was put to work and the sharp knife of the mower found the little fawn while it was cuddled up in the herbage. One leg was cut quite badly—so badly that the baby deer was unable to get up. It was taken care of by Mr. Watson and the injured leg treated. The little chap seemed to understand that it was in good hands and responded to the treatment. It was left where found and each day the mother doe came along and attended to the provision of food, the youngster gaining health and strength daily. Now the little chap has fully recovered and is able to fight its own life battle. Mr and Mrs. Watson are well pleased to know that the fawn they cared for is able to follow its mother and enjoy the freedom of Groton woods. It has been accorded to very few, even those who spend much time in the wilds, to see baby deer nurtured as Mr and Mrs. Watson saw their little pet.

### THE NORTH POLE AT THE EDEN MUSEE.

Every event of world-wide importance is represented in wax or moving pictures at the Eden Musee of New York City. A new group just placed on exhibition in the Crypt, shows the discovery of the North Pole by Dr. Cook. A large space has been fitted up to represent the Polar regions. In this desolate and dreary field of ice, standing on the apex of the world, Dr. Cook is seen planting the American flag. With him as intensely interested spectators of the solem event, are the two Esquimaux who accompanied him. Nearby are the dogs, with all the trappings which made the journey possible. The figure of Dr. Cook was made from accurate measurements and the surroundings were carefully made from detailed statements by the discoverer. Altogether it is one of the most realistic and life-like groups in the Musee. On account of the interest in the approaching election, life-like representations of the Mayoralty candidates have been placed in the large Central Hall. The figures of Bannard, Gaylor and Hearst are life-like and represent the candidates in their characteristic pose. In the Winter Garden, new moving pictures are shown hourly, afternoon and evening. The subjects include sports, little journeys in far-away lands, humorous scenes and mysterious happenings. The Potofone presents talking pictures which are wonderfully realistic. The afternoon and evening concerts by the Royal Blue Hungarian orchestra will have attractive programs of classical music.

### A BANQUET OF NOTE WITH CHARMING SOUVENIR.

At the Banquet held at the Hotel Cecil on the 21st of September, there were present the Foreign Secretary, Sir Edward Grey and the representatives of the Corps Diplomatique. There were also a large number of ladies accompanying the delegates from the twenty-four nations and the British Journalists. An agreeable surprise awaited all the lady guests, for by their Menu lay a white case which on being opened was found to contain a very pleasing memento of the banquet—a white silk sash entitled "Queen Alexandra Souvenir," with Her Majesty's Arms embossed in gold, as were also the Badge of the Conference embracing the Arms of the City of London and the words "British International Association of Journalists." The box was tastefully tied with ribbon of Royal purple, and the Casket filled with Queen Alexandra Chocolates. The order for the Souvenir was entrusted to J. S. Fry & Sons Ltd., of Bristol and London, Appointed Manufacturers to Her Majesty, whose name was chosen to commemorate the visit of the Conference to Windsor.

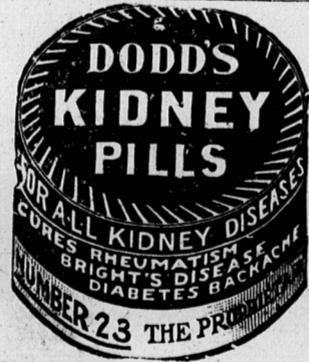

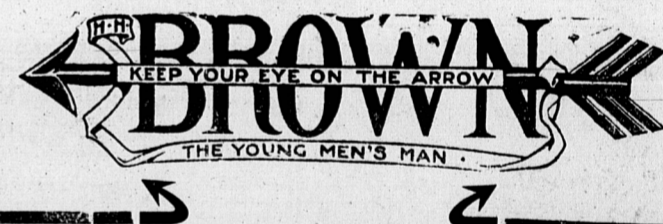
