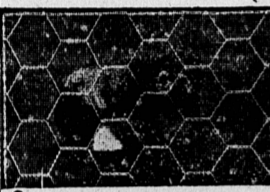

RADIO BROADCASTING.—Messrs Burke and Gesner, proprietors of CHCK, radio station, inform the Guardian that there was no intentional discourtesy to radio fans in broadcasting their usual evening programme on the occasion of the broadcasting of Premier Bennett's speech from Ottawa. Their broadcasting period daily is from 5 p. m. to 7 p. m. and the other broadcasting station has the practical monopoly of the remaining 22 hours. On the day in question CHCK was approached two hours before their programme went on the air to withdraw in favor of the Canadian tie-up for Mr. Bennett. As important advertising contracts had been undertaken for the entertainment in question and no arrangements could be made with the contractors to give way in the short time in favor of the tie-up, CHCK had reluctantly to decline the Canadian tie-up. This and no other reason was why CHCK was on the air last Wednesday. If the management of the Canadian tie-up desires subsequent Imperial speeches to be broadcast during the same period in the future it will be necessary for them to make arrangements with CHCK a reasonable time in advance of the date of the broadcast.

MONCTON, Oct. 20.—The opening meeting of the Diocesan Convention of the Catholic Women's League was held last evening in the K. C. hall and was largely attended by delegates to the sessions and a large number of interested citizens. Mrs. E. C.
