Poles shall be of Spruce or Fir, straight and sound. Lumber except where specified, shall be spruce or hemlock, all square edged and sawn to the exact size specified, perfectly sound and free from wane and shakes.

Material for Lots Nos. 1 to 14 and for lots Nos. 23 to 28 and for Lot No. 30 shall be delivered on or before the 15th day of April 1933. PERFECT MIRROR SAID TO BE OF VALUE FOR OPTICAL INSTRUMENTS

NEW YORK, Feb. 15—(A. P.)—Science comes a step closer to the perfect mirror, one which will reflect every bit of the light, with a new metal surface announced last night in the Physical Review by Hiram W. Edwards of the University of California.

He evaporates upon glass a mixture of white metals, aluminum and magnesium. They form a film which reflects 94 per cent of the light and maintains this percentage efficiency equally with the primary colors, red, green and blue separately.

This high reflection of blue light gives the new mirror its greater power. Silver, for example, which reflects 95 per cent of red light, gives off only 85 per cent of the blue. Pure aluminum alone, Mr. Edwards finds, is not as good a reflector as the combination with magnesium.

These mirrors, he says, should be of considerable value in various optical instruments where front surfaces of high reflecting power are desirable.
