IN MEMORIAM

MR. C. W. F. SEALE The death occurred at his home on School Street, Charlottetown, Thursday forenoon, of Mr. C. W. F. Seale. He was born sixty years ago in Devonshire, England, the son of a clergyman of the Church of England.

For thirty-five years he has been a citizen of Charlottetown. On first coming here he entered the employ of W. Grant and Company, agricultural implement dealers who conducted a branch of the International Harvester Company in this province. Mr. Seale had charge of the books and of repair department. When Mr. Samuel Kennedy took over the business, Mr. Seale remained with him, carrying on his duties as before, most capably and faithfully to the satisfaction of the firm and of its patrons.

For the past two years he has been laid aside from work owing to heart trouble and about three weeks ago his illness took a very serious turn and since then he grew gradually weaker until he passed away.
