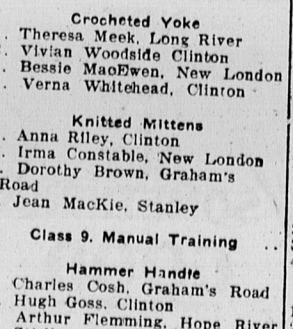

Not Suitable To Prevent Age

LONDON, Oct. 11—Bishop Welton, dean of Durham, is the latest prominent convert to the belief that the phraseology of the marriage service should be revised. In a speech at Nottingham, favoring a general revision of the Book of Common Prayers in the Church of England, he took strong exception to the preface to the marriage service, which, he said, is painful, distressing to many brides and bridegrooms, adding: "It is simply the laws of historical perspective which excuse such language on such occasions. I do not think that a book dating back over more than 25 years can be expected to satisfy the present age." The Rev. R. J. Campbell, one of the most prominent Church of England divines and religious writers, strongly supports Bishop Welton's contention regarding the marriage service, saying: "I deliberately omit from it those phrases which bring a blush to the cheek of a young bride. I have no intention of telling her that possibly she is a 'brute beast' and has 'no understanding,' strictly speaking. I have no right to omit these sections, but no authority would nowadays censure me for so doing."

TUNNEL IN PARIS TO BE DEMOLISHED

PARIS, Oct. 12—The Batignolles tunnel, near the St. Lazare station, in which a read-end collision of two suburban trains last Wednesday resulted in forty deaths and numerous injuries, will be demolished. Minister of Public Works, Le Troquer, who made this announcement today, said authorization for demolition of the tunnel was given by the 1912 Parliament, but that the work had been postponed because of the war. The work of demolition will be begun on October 17, he said.
