GREAT AGRICULTURIST HONORED IN TRINIDAD

PORT OF SPAIN, TRINIDAD, Nov. 12.—(By the Canadian Press)—Agriculturists from all parts of Trinidad, wearing white headbands in a rude little wooden hut in the heart of the Arena Forest, recently paid tribute to the memory of the late Sir Francis Pictet Hon. A. B. Carr, president of the Trinidad and Tobago agricultural society, moved a resolution extending sympathy to the relatives of the man whose death is a great loss to the colony and to agriculture in the whole of the West Indies.

Born in Devon 71 years ago, Sir Francis worked in the interests of West India agriculture for 40 years and strove to implant a love of nature in the children attending the schools. He was buried on the grounds of the

West Indian agricultural college here, among the plant life he has tended. He was principal of the college from 1921 to 1924.

The Arena Forest was chosen because it contains one of the most halcyon spots in the whole West Indies, and the agriculturists had gone there as guests of the forest department to observe the great progress being made in reforestation. Four hundred years ago three missionaries, the governor and the principal authorities were put to death by Indians who had invited them to a banquet on the occasion of the inauguration of a mission for the Indians.

A wooden cross marks the last resting place of the victims of one of the most blood-thirsty attacks ever made on strangers to the Islands by the Indians they found there. In 1687, the King of Spain, according to

Fraser's history "confided to the Capuchins of the Province of Catalonia the spiritual charge of the Indians of Trinidad. Five 'Missions' (Indian Settlements under the joint charge of a Priest and of a Civil Magistrate) were formed. In Dec., 1699, when they opened a mission in the Island of Trinidad under the name of San Francisco de los Arenales the Indians, prompted by the devil, put to a cruel death the three Missionaries who had undertaken the charge of it."

According to a tradition which still exists among the old Spaniards of the Island, it would appear that the Governor and the principal authorities were also present at the banquet giving on the occasion of this inauguration of the Mission of San Francisco, and that on a preconcerted signal being made they were all massacred by the Indians.

The funeral will be held from her late home, 32 Portledge avenue, on Thursday afternoon, with service at 2 o'clock, leaving for Elmwood cemetery at 2.30.—Moncton Transcript.


### IN MEMORIAM
