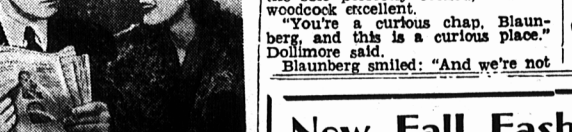
"I wonder if there is anything about Fernandez or Sadie Pachmann in the records here?" "Go and find out," Ducros said.

THE COOK'S CORNER

SWEET CHILI SAUCE

- 30 ripe tomatoes, medium size 6 pears 4 onions, medium size 4 red peppers 1 cup brown sugar 3 tbsp. oil 2 tsp. whole cloves 2 tsp. whole allspice 2 tsp. stick cinnamon 1 1/2 pints vinegar

Tie the spices in a cheesecloth bag, loosely to allow for swelling. Remove the seeds from the peppers. Peel and core the pears and peaches. The tomatoes may be skinned or not as desired. Chop all ingredients and combine. Place in a preserving kettle and bring to the boil. Stir frequently to prevent sticking. Boil for 1-2 to 2 hours or till thickened. Pour into hot, sterilized jars and seal.

Individual Peach Cobblers 4 cups sliced peaches 1 1/4 cups sugar 3-4 cup water 2 tablespoons butter 1-4 cup sugar 1 egg 1 cup flour 1 teaspoon baking powder 1-3 cup milk (about)

Method: Peel and slice the peaches. Add the first amount of sugar and the water and then stir slowly in a covered pan until the fruit is tender; Divide evenly in six well buttered baking dishes or custard cups.

Drop spoonfuls of the batter over the top of the peaches and then sprinkle lightly with granulated sugar. Bake in a moderate, 375 deg. F. oven for about 25 to 30 minutes, until the cake part is nicely browned. Cool slightly, then invert and serve on dessert plates, topping each cobbler with whipped cream or, if you want something very extra special, with a spoonful of vanilla ice cream!

WAX CLEAN FLOORS Always remove all soiled wax from floors before re-waxing. It will usually come off readily with a wash of warm soapy water. Stubborn spots can be removed with a little carbon tetrachloride. Allow floor to dry thoroughly before applying the new coat. If you use a no rub wax, apply according to directions. If you prefer the kind which requires polishing, use a thin coat and rub to a high gloss.
