SETTLED AND UN-SETTLED PROBLEMS.

So far as Cuba and Porto Rico are concerned it is definitely settled that Spain shall have nothing more to do with them. What is not settled is what the United States will do with them.

The tobacco growers and the producers of sugar in the United States proper have protested that free admission of Porto Rican, Cuban and Philippine sugar and tobacco would prove ruinous, and the protest has been sufficiently effective to cause the Washington government to decide that cigars, cheroots and sugar from all their new possessions must pay duty on being admitted to the United States.

As to the Phillipines, Spain is likely to receive at least something in the way of an indemnity,—it may be as much as thirty or forty millions—in consideration of making a friendly surrender of the group.

But if the commission at Paris is likely to agree upon terms that will secure the Phillipines to the United States there is yet an or-

deal that the treaty must pass in which the result will be doubtful. All treaties with foreign powers made by the United States must be sanctioned by the Senate of the nation. And it is somewhat doubtful whether the Senate would be willing to accept the responsibilities that will go with the possession of the Phillipines, even were no money required to be paid out in the transaction.

A special despatch to THE GUARDIAN from Prince Albert announces the election of Mr. Samuel McLeod, formerly of Bradaldane, P. E. I., to the Northwest legislature. It is quite a feather in McLeod's cap that the victory was over the late speaker in the Northwest Assembly.

We are glad to note the praiseworthy efforts of the Patriot to shorten the winter. Its latest quotation of the length of the seasons gives the summer 93 days 14 hours and the winter but 89 days one hour. It is not a very great gain, perhaps, but it is a step in the right direction.
