ance. The proper time to "throw up the sponge," as Premier Bell put it, is NOW.

About this time last year the welkin was made to ring with shoutings, and the Patriot (fore-headed with alarming statements concerning the big debt of the province, bequeathed by the Arsenal Government. It is now time for them to come out with another annual statement of the DEBT OF THE PROVINCE AS IT STANDS UNDER BELL MANAGEMENT. Then as it appeared they conjured up liabilities of approaching a quarter of a million dollars. And they made the most of it in their campaign of slander against their predecessors. Will the Government, or their organ the Patriot declare what their over-draft is at the banks today. Or more definite still, will they, after all their tax collections, covering both last year's and this, publicly declare their present overdrafts at the banks will amount to less than a million dollars. Don't misunderstand our question, and let the public have, if they get down to

it, a truthful question, declaring WHAT THE OVERDRAFT OF THE PROVINCE IS, and further declaring that IT WILL NOT NOW EXCEED ONE MILLION DOLLARS.

Last February when that memorable report of the Falconwood Commission was published the columns of the Patriot were charged with a high voltage of bombast and threat of what was going to happen to the Opposition when the House met. When the time came the Hon. Mr. Arsenault and his colleagues actually took their seats as boldly and unconcernedly as if there was no danger, real or imaginary. More remarkable than this, when the Public Accounts or Falconwood matters were even hinted at the whole combination composing the Government, with the white feather attached to their coat tails hurried and scurried to whatever cover for safety they could reach, and with as much disorder and precipitation as if all the fiends of the inferno were on their track. Is history going to repeat itself? In its closing editorial on the Prince of Wales College bungle, it hints that in all probability this matter will be "threshed out" when the legislature meets. Again it points out to the next session of the House as the time in which the Dalton Sanatorium matter is to be discussed and disposed of. How sweet seems the unclions of delay to these self-proclaimed progressives. And what guarantee have we got that it would not be as studiously avoided then as the Public Accounts and Falconwood were at the last session?
