PHOTOGRAPHS
TAKEN AT NIGHT

The New Process Introduced
 by Dr. Gould.

Claimed that the Finish and Work-
 manship is Equal to the Best
 —A Unique Process of Art.

A representative of The Guardian had
 the privilege last evening of visiting the
 new photographic studio of Dr. Forrest
 B. Gould in the Bank of Nova Scotia
 building. The studio which is con-
 ducted on altogether new lines for Charlot-
 tetown is neatly fitted but Dr. Gould will
 shortly remove to the Brass Building
 where he will have larger and more con-
 venient quarters.

The photographic work is conducted
 altogether at night and is thus most con-
 venient for those employed during the
 day.

The defects of ordinary flashlight work
 are entirely obviated and the specimen
 photographs turned out are highly
 creditable.

During Dr. Gould's earlier efforts
 several years ago to bring art floral light
 to a successful issue in photography he
 employed the electric arc lamps and suc-
 ceeded in obtaining perfectly natural
 pictures so much so that the most expert
 photographers could not distinguish them
 from those produced by daylight. He
 was awarded a patent from the United
 States on the devices by which he
 brought the light under control. He has
 never found some objects to their use
 as it required several lamps to afford
 sufficient power and volume of light
 to permit of its proper diffusion. He has
 now constructed a lamp for burning a
 compound element which affords a light
 of great power and admits of the most
 thorough diffusion so that the subject
 sitting under it experiences no discomfort
 whatever. These photos when com-
 pleted are substantially equal in quality
 to those taken by artificial light,
 but such do not compare in delicacy of
 shading or harmonious blending of light
 or shadow with those produced by day-
 light. In accordance with his
 invention he has aimed to do
 and has brought the artificial light
 under the natural laws of light, as it
 were, so that the rays of artificial light
 fall upon the subject in the same manner
 as does natural light. By this method the
 lights are regulated and soft and to pro-
 duce an harmonious blending of the light
 and shade and his efforts are surprisingly
 successful in the softness and clearness
 obtained by his methods, and in all the
 delicate values that give a photo its artis-
 tic worth.

The scenery will be frequently changed.
 Now a woodland scene is running and
 later he will have boat, military and
 other backgrounds. The management
 will also be increased and the business
 enlarged. Dr. Gould will remove shortly
 to the Brass Building on Queen Street
 when further announcements will
 be made. In the meantime
 he will give sittings by private arrange-
 ment at the Bank of Nova Scotia Building.

EASTERN NOTES.—The last days of July
 with weather intensely hot.—Bay making
 is becoming general with crop light.
 Other crops look well especially potatoes,
 and no bugs with the large majority.—A
 good school of hake is still on the
 south side, but few caught for want of
 bait. At present it looks as if mackerel
 is going to be a failure, a keen disappoint-
 ment to fishermen, fish dealers and all
 as great and expensive preparations have
 been made for their reception, and the
 success or non-success of this fishery
 means much for the amount of money in
 circulation. Some ten vessels are here
 with nets in their pursuit but have not met
 with much success as it looks as if the fish
 is not here. They pursued the same
 method as is adopted in Scotland for her-
 ring fishing. Tie a number of nets together
 and let them drift with the tide. A few
 nights ago a vessel supposed to be an
 Island one, with thirty miles of open
 water south and east of her set her nets
 close to the shore fishermen's trawls and
 net, and lifted among them during the
 night for a mile and a half from Basin
 Head east of West River, cutting the
 net, leaving the shore fish-
 erman's gear in a hard con-
 dition, and some has not been found
 yet. His own nets didn't escape unscat-
 tered as numerous pieces of them have been
 found mixed up with the wreck of lines
 and nets. Needless to say, not much sym-
 pathy is expressed for them by the shore
 fishermen.—Visitors and tourists are still
 going and coming. Mr. John Bruce, Red
 Point had a visit from her father, James
 Needham, and her uncle A. Hobbs, both
 residents of New England, the latter for
 many years.—Much satisfaction is ex-
 pressed on all sides at the grant for a
 law survey of the Branch Railway to
 Elmira. Though long in coming we hope
 the East is to get justice at last.
