COMMISSIONERS MAKE THIN REPORT

REGINA, SASK., August 24.—The Brown-Elwood Commission, appointed to inquire into the bribery and conspiracy charges made by J. E. Bradshaw, Conservative member for the Saskatchewan Legislature for Prince Albert, against members of the Liberal Government and other Liberal members and ex-Liberal members of the House, have handed in their report to the Lieutenant-Governor.

The commissioners render separate reports in the charge laid against ex-members of the Legislature, G. Ens and J. F. Bole, and one of the charges against Hon. A. P. McNab, minister of public works for Saskatchewan. J. A. Sheppard, member for Moose Jaw County and speaker in the Legislature, and S. R. Moore, member for Pinto Creek, are found guilty of receiving money in connection with the securing of licenses; H. C. Pierce, member for Wadena, is found guilty of bribery; and C. H. Cawthorpe, member for Big-

far is found guilty of both bribery and receiving money in connection with a promise to abstain from prosecution.

Mr. Bradshaw charged eight members of the Legislature with having accepted bribes to oppose the Government bill to abolish the bar introduced in the Assembly in December, 1913. He further made eight charges involving five members, including two ministers, of stifling prosecutions in return for money or promises of political support. He also laid eleven charges involving five members of having received money from liquor licenses, in connection with the securing of liquor licenses. Of twenty-seven charges made by Mr. Bradshaw two were dropped by him, and fifteen are dismissed by the commission. Of the remaining ten charges, the commission agrees in its finding against the members charged in 7—seven cases. These seven charges affect four private members. With regard to the other three charges, Commissioners Brown and Elwood made separate findings; the former that no case is made out establishing the truth of the charge, and the latter, while not always finding that the charge as laid was proven, finds that there was evidence to either support the charge or to establish some connection between the charge and the party charged.

Of the thirteen men named by Mr. Bradshaw, seven are exonerated by the commission of the charges laid against them, namely, Hon. W. F. A. Turgeon, Hon. George Langley, Hon. A. P. McNab, A. F. Totzke, J. Nolin, C. Leochard and S. I. Simpson. Two others, J. F. Bole and G. Ens, ex-members of the Legislature, are exonerated by Commissioner Elwood. The

other four, J. A. Sheppard, member for Moose Jaw; S. R. Moore, member for Pinto Creek; H. C. Pierce, member for Wadena, and C. H. Cawthorpe, member for Biggar, are held to be guilty, the first two of receiving money in connection with a promise to stifle prosecutions.

In the case of one of the charges against Hon. A. P. McNab, the commissioner finds separately, Commissioner Brown says that in his opinion there is no evidence in support of the charge "on which he would be warranted in imputing wrong-doing to McNab," while Commissioner Elwood declares that "Mr. McNab's evidence is by no means satisfactory concluding that the prosecutions in question were withdrawn as the result of an interview which took place between William Roberts, an hotel licensee, and McNab.

British Use New Type Of Aeroplane

LONDON, August 25.—A new type of aeroplane now being used by the British at the front has already accounted for 37 Fokkers, according to a statement made by Baron Montagu, C. G. Grey, editor of the Aeroplane, gives the following description of this new aerial destroyer:

"These small fighting machines are distinctly a British product, first being introduced by the Sopwith firm a year or so before the war, and from that first experiment they have been developed and fitted with more and more powerful engines, until today the British scout biplane is the fastest thing in the world, except a projectile from a gun. The German Fokker monoplane is a fast destroyer, but its success is limited to some extent."

"The improvement in the English aeroplanes may eventually have a considerable effect on the air defenses of this country for the improvement in aeroplanes must necessarily be more rapid than the improvement in aeroplanes, and consequently it is quite probable that new types of destroyer aeroplanes may be produced which will make it almost impossible for airships to get away from this country if they ever reach it."

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

The sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.

Entries—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Entries—Six months residence in each of three years after cutting homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exchanged his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be introduced for cultivation under certain conditions.
